Clinic returns to Des Moines: This year's clinic will return to West Des Moines at the Sheraton Hotel, 1800 50th Street, on January 22-23, 2016. You can make reservations on-line by contacting the Sheraton Hotel at <https://www.starwoodmeeting.com/Book/IHSCoachesbaseball>. We are very excited with our list of clinic speakers this year. On Friday afternoon, we will have USA Baseball coach and instructor Bill Krecji, University of Iowa head coach Rick Heller and his staff, and Northwestern College head coach Brian Wede. Our coaches mini-clinics will conclude Friday's sessions running from 4:55 to 6:50 pm. On Saturday, we will have our annual IHSAA rules meeting, along with Dallas Baptist head coach Dan Heefner, KC Royals "AAA" Omaha Storm Chasers Manager Brian Poldberg, Accelerated Rehab talking about a proven off-season throwing program and arm care, and rounding out our speakers with North Iowa Area Community College assistant coach Pete Lauritson. We will continue to host the annual McDonalds/FCA Breakfast on Saturday morning starting at 7:30 am. Mike Botts is heading-up the umpire side of the clinic. Our Umpire sessions will follow the same time frame on both Friday and Saturday. Hope to see everyone there.

Vendors will be allowed to start setting-up their displays on Friday morning beginning at 9:00 am. The clinic sessions will begin at 1:00 pm on Friday afternoon and continue through Saturday, concluding at 3:30 pm.

The Awards Banquet will be held at the Sheraton Hotel on Saturday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. We are again looking forward to another outstanding weekend of baseball. With the clinic fast approaching, please check to make sure your membership has been paid for the 2015-2016 season. The new membership calendar year started on September 1, 2015 and runs through August 31, 2016. If your mailing label does not say 2016 on it, your dues have not yet been paid for this year. If you have questions, please give Lee Toole a call. Schools are reminded to take advantage of the school membership group rates. A reminder of how the discount works: the head coach is \$30.00, the first assistant coach is \$30.00, the second assistant coach is \$20.00, and the third assistant coach and beyond are \$15.00 each. The only catch to qualify for this coaching staff group discount rate is that all coaches, from the same school, must send in their membership forms together at the same time.

The Board and Steering Committee will meet on Thursday night, January 21st at the Sheraton Hotel. For that dedication, passion, and commitment to the association, we would like to honor Ted Tornow with the 2015 IHSBCA President's Award. Ted is currently the general manager for the Clinton LumberKings, which is the minor league Class "A" affiliate for the Seattle Mariners. Ted has been involved with professional baseball for over 28 years and has spent the past 13 years directing the LumberKings organization. Ted was honored in 2010 after being named the Midwest League's Executive of the Year. One of Ted's most memorable moments was when he handled the media operations for the professional baseball debut for Bo Jackson. Ted has hosted the All-Star Series three times over a 10 year period. This past summer, Ted graciously allowed us to play our all-star games on his field with a very short notice to work with. Harold "Pinky" Primrose Award to Brian Poldberg:



Brian Poldberg, the Kansas City Royals Triple-A manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, played his high school baseball in Council Bluffs at baseball rich Thomas Jefferson High School. Brian was an infielder and also played basketball while in high school. He graduated in 1975. Brian began his college baseball career at Wayne State College. He also spent time at Fort Hays State University. He graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Emporia State University. He played baseball all four years of college. Brian signed with the New York Yankees in 1980, where he played one year in Class A and two years in Class Double-A. In 1983, Brian signed with the Kansas City Royals organization. He played three years in Triple-A for the Royals in Omaha. He started his coaching career in 1987 with the Royals organization in the minor leagues. While with the Royals, he has served as a manager at all levels. He is known for his exhaustive work with catchers. Brian won many minor league championships during his minor league tenure. He won championships in the Carolina League, Texas League, Pacific Coast League, and the Triple-A National Championship in 2013 and 2014. From 2004 to 2007, Brian served as a bull pen coach, first base coach, and third base coach for the Kansas City Royals. Six are selected to enter the IHSBCA Hall of Fame

This year, the IHSBCA Hall of Fame Class of 2016 will induct three coaches, two players, and one contributor. This year's inductee's are: Jeff Scharn (Coach) from Sioux Central, Steve Daeges (Coach) from Harlan, Tim O'Neill (Coach) from Des Moines, Casey Blake (Player) from Indianola, Jeff Clement (Player) from Marshalltown, and Brian O'Connor (Contributor) from Council Bluffs. The Hall of Fame class of 2016 will be inducted during the IHSBCA Awards Banquet on Saturday, January 23, 2016, in Des Moines. They will join the 260 previously inducted Hall of Fame members.

Steve Daeges (Coach) – You mention Harlan athletics and usually the first thing that comes to mind is football. But, Steve Daeges has made it a point to bring baseball to the forefront of that conversation. Steve has been the Harlan baseball coach for the past 22 years. He has accumulated a record of 567 - 198. During that time period, he has taken his team to the state tournament 12 times, with 2 state titles and 3 runner-up finishes. Steve is a Harlan graduate, where he pitched, played short and third for four years on the varsity. Steve played college baseball at Dana College in Blair, Nebraska. Steve continues to be active within his community promoting youth baseball. He started the Little Cyclone Baseball Organization in Harlan back in 1995. The program promotes the development of young players ages 9-14. He also provides camps and clinics for players and youth coaches in the Harlan area. Steve has been named District Coach of the Year 4 times and the 3A State Coach of the Year twice. Steve is a member of the Dana College Athletic Hall of Fame and the Old-timer Baseball Association Hall of Fame as a player.

Tim O'Neill (Coach) - It seems that everywhere Coach O'Neill has been as the head baseball coach, that school has become a very successful baseball program and wins state titles. Tim comes from a baseball background. He played his high school baseball for Coach Gary Nyhus at Mason City Newman. During that time, Newman won 3 conference titles and participated in the state tournament. Tim was also named Newman's team captain his senior season. Tim went on and played junior college baseball at North Iowa CC in Mason City. He was a two year starter and was named to the All-Region Team his second season. Tim went on to the University of Northern Iowa where he was a student assistant coach from 1990-92. Tim has an impressive high school coaching resume. He won state titles while at Sioux City Heelan and West Des Moines Dowling. He has been named State Coach of the Year in class 3A and 4A. Tim has received the District Coach of the Year 9 times and earned Assistant Coach of the Year twice. Tim has had 30 of his former players go on to play D-I college baseball, 7 players go on to professional baseball with 2 making the major leagues. He has a career record of 420-198. Tim has also

had success coaching at the AAU and Legion levels. Taking AAU teams to Japan and his Legion teams to the regional finals in Fargo, North Dakota.

Jeff Scharn (Coach) - Jeff is a long time member of the association. He has been very active within the organization. Jeff has served on a variety of committees, has coached in the summer All-Star Series, has chaired his areas All-District meetings, has served on the board of directors representing northwest Iowa, and represented the association on the IHSAA advisory board. Jeff is a high school graduate from Lytton Community Schools. He was a 4 year starter, lettering all four years in high school. Jeff played in the 1980 All-Star Series. Jeff went on to Wayne State College in Wayne, Nebraska. He played varsity baseball for the Wildcats. Jeff changed positions and caught his final three seasons at Wayne State. Jeff began his baseball coaching career in 1985 at Sioux Valley Schools. In 1990, the district reorganized into Sioux Central where he continued to hold the same position that he still currently has today. Jeff is going on 31 years in the same school district. During those 3 years, Jeff has taken four teams to the state tournament, with one runner-up finish. He has 7 district titles and 11 conference titles under his belt. Jeff is a member of the 600 win club. Baseball has been an integral part of getting Jeff to where he is today. Playing the game throughout his youth, he developed a love for the game. That love inspired him to come back home after his college days and give back to the youth and other coaches in his area.

Casey Blake (Player) - Casey played his high school baseball at Indianola High School where he excelled on and off the athletic field. Casey was a four sport standout at Indianola High School where he played baseball, football, basketball, and ran track. He was named one of the top ten high school athletes in the history of Iowa. Casey attended Wichita State University, where he was a three-time All-American, two-time Academic All-American and participated in the College World Series. Casey was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in 1996. He made his MLB debut on August 14, 1999, against the Oakland Athletics. He recorded his first MLB hit on August 29 against the Texas Rangers, and his first homerun on October 2 against the Cleveland Indians. The Minnesota Twins claimed Casey off waivers from the Blue Jays in 2000, where he primarily played at the AAA level. He did appear in 20 MLB games with the Twins. Casey spent time with Baltimore and again with Minnesota before becoming the Cleveland Indians' everyday third baseman in 2003. He led the team in games played with 152, hits (143), and doubles (35) while compiling career highs in every offensive category. Casey spent four years playing third base and right field for the Indians. Casey was

trade to the Los Angeles Dodgers in July 2008. In his first game as a Dodger, Casey went 2 for 3 with a double and a run scored. In 2009, Casey hit .280 with 18 homeruns for the Dodgers and his fielding percentage was the best all-time for a Dodger third baseman. Due to various injuries, Casey was only able to appear in 63 games for the Dodgers in 2011. He decided to undergo season-ending surgery on his neck to relieve the pain from a pinched nerve that had bothered him all season. The Dodgers declined Casey's 2012 option, instead paying him with a buyout and making him a free agent. Casey signed with the Colorado Rockies, but was released before the end of spring training. Casey announced his retirement on May 8, 2012. Casey is back home living in Indianola. He and his wife began a foundation which has helped the Indianola school district to build the district's athletic, academic and fine arts programs.

Jeff Clement (Player) – During a four year career at Marshalltown High School, Jeff Clement led his team to 137 wins, three state tournament appearances and a State Championship in 2002. Along the way, he also became the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association's only 4-time elite first team All-State selection. Clement's 75 career home runs and 214 bases on balls remain national high school records. He had a career batting average of .515 for the Bobcats as well as a 15-1 record and 21 saves on the mound. In his first collegiate season at the University of Southern California in 2003, Clement was selected as the Collegiate Baseball Freshman National Co-Player of the Year and the Pac-10 Conference Freshman of the Year. He led

the Trojans in home runs (21), RBI's (53), runs (53), walks (32) and slugging % (.649). Clement played for the U.S. National Team in 2003 and 2004, leading the Americans to the gold medal at the SISU II World University Baseball Championships in Taiwan in 2004. He was also selected as the MVP for Team USA during the 33rd-Annual USA vs. Japan Collegiate All-Star Series. Following his final season at USC in 2005, Clement closed out his Trojan career ranked second with 46 career home runs (to Mark McGwire's 54), and was named recipient of the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top college catcher. After being selected the No. 3 overall pick in the MLB Draft, Clement spent parts of four seasons in the majors with the Seattle Mariner and Pittsburgh Pirate organizations. As a catcher and first baseman, he played in 152 big league games before retiring after the 2013 season in the Minnesota Twins organization. While finishing his Bachelor's Degree in 2015 Clement was the volunteer assistant coach on Rick Heller's staff at the University of Iowa. Jeff now resides in Ankeny with his wife Lindsay and four children: Jake, Ben, Allie and Leah.



College Coach of the Year Nominations

2 Year College Coach Nominations

Marc Rardin - Iowa Western Community College

Coach Rardin begins his 14th season as the head coach at Iowa Western. During Rardin's time leading the Reivers baseball program, Rardin's teams have rewritten the record books in every facet of the program and made the junior college baseball history by winning the Junior College World Series in 2010, 2012, and 2014. They are first Northern District representative to ever win the Junior College World Series. In the 13 seasons at Iowa Western, Rardin's Reivers have participated in 9 Junior College World Series, have won 11 consecutive Regional titles, and 9 Northern District titles. That's 23 post season titles, more than any other Division I junior college program in the country. Rardin's teams have averaged nearly 46 wins per season and have a record of 615 wins to only 179 losses. That is a winning percentage of .775. In that same time period, he has accumulated 284 wins to only 48 losses in regular season conference and conference tournament play. That is a .855 winning percentage. This past summer, Coach Rardin was the Head Coach of the USA Junior College National Team that participated in the 80th year of the NBC Tournament in Wichita, KS. The team finished 3rd in the tournament. He also coached players at the USA Baseball Training Facility in Cary, North Carolina.

Travis Hergert - North Iowa Area Community College

Travis enters his 4th season as NIACC's head baseball coach, with a 105-65 career record. His 2015 team went 49-16 overall (school record for wins) and 20-8 in the ICCAC. The Trojan's won the NJCAA Region XI Tournament and claimed the North Plains District title to advance to the NJCAA Division II World Series for the second time in three years. In 2014, Hergert's squad finished 25-13 with a third place finish in the NJCAA Region XI Tournament, the second highest finish in school history. In 2013, NIACC was 31-18 overall and 11-9 in the league in Hergert's first season as the head coach after spending the previous 8 seasons as the team's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. NIACC won the NJCAA Region XI Tournament, won the North Plains district title, and placed 5th at the NJCAA Division II World Series. In his first season as pitching coach, Hergert's staff posted a school record 39 wins and featured two NJCAA All-Region XI selections, including Pitcher of the Year and Arizona State signee, Steve Salas. Salas was a 22nd round pick by the Anaheim Angels in the 2006 MLB Draft.



4 Year College Coach Nominations

Rick Heller – University of Iowa

Rick is entering his third season as head coach of the Hawkeye baseball program. Heller was tabbed as the 20th head coach in the Iowa baseball program history. Coach Heller is a native of Eldon, Iowa and has been a head coach at four institutions - Iowa, Indiana State, UNI, and Upper Iowa. In 2015, Heller guided the Hawkeyes to an at-large berth into the NCAA Regional play and posted the school's first NCAA Tournament win since 1972. Heller is the winningest coach in the first two seasons in Iowa history, posting a 71-41 record, and he is one of two UI head coaches to lead the program to the NCAA Tournament. In 28 seasons as a head coach, Heller owns a career record of 761-606-4. The Hawkeyes had a breakthrough season in Heller's second season in Iowa City, going 41-18 with the 41 victories being the second-most all-time and just the fourth 40-win season in program history. Iowa earned the school's first NCAA Regional berth since 1990, where they went 2-2 at the Springfield Regional. The Hawkeyes rolled to a 15-5 start and won its first 11 series of the season, including a school-record 8 consecutive Big Ten series wins, dating back to the 2014 season. Iowa swept No. 19 Indiana to open the Big Ten play to catapult the Hawkeyes into the national rankings for the first time in 25 years. Iowa climbed to as high as No. 13 before finishing the year 20th by Collegiate Baseball, 25th by Baseball America, and 28th by NCBWA - the program's 1st appearance in final rankings in school history.

Steve Cook - Coe College

Coach Cook came to Coe in 1996 as an assistant baseball coach, moving to the head coaching position the following year. Cook is a 1993 graduate of Allegheny College in Pennsylvania, a traditional NCAA Division III powerhouse. A four-year starter in the infield, Cook was an All-American in 1993 when his nationally ranked team finished 37-5 overall. Cook was inducted into the Allegheny College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009. He spent three years in the minor leagues, including a stop with the Cedar Rapids Kernels. During the 1994 season, Cook and the Kernels won the Midwest League title. Cook has compiled a career coaching record of 414-382-1. His 380 wins are the most in school history. Cook's teams have recorded the top six win totals in school history, including a 32 win season in 2011 and a 29 win season in 2012. Coe made the NCAA Regional Tournament both of those years after winning the Iowa Conference Tournament. Coe finished the 2015 season as the IAC Tournament Champs, with a record of 34-14, and a trip to the NCAA Regional Finals. That is Coe College's fourth trip to the NCAA Regionals in the past 10 years for Coach Cook's squad.

4. Big thank you to all volunteers but more are needed.


