The Power of Priority  
Luke 9:51

The purpose of a scope on a rifle is to hit the target. With the precision of the cross hairs on Calvary, Jesus focused on his target. He was to be the Lamb of God. As a man, he was pulled in many directions by distractions within and without. Instead of being splintered by the endless needs that surrounded him, he

was compelled by an intense focus on the one need that separated humanity from the Father.



I believe it is possible to be so scattered in our sense of duty to hurting people that we lose the power of priority. We can get tangled up in the complexities of religious expectations. We can become bogged down in our own conflicted feelings. There is no way to avoid the needs and ex-

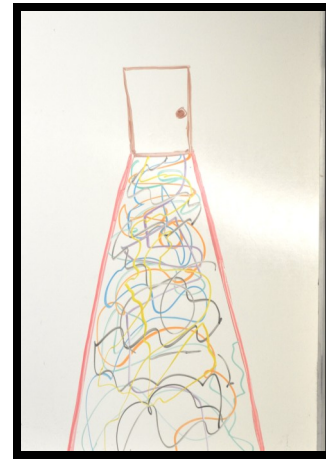
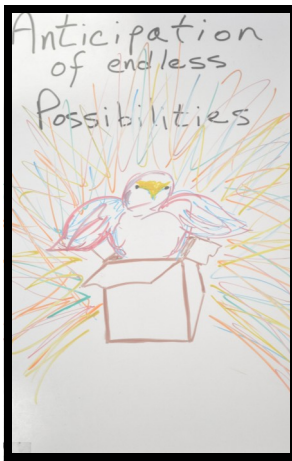
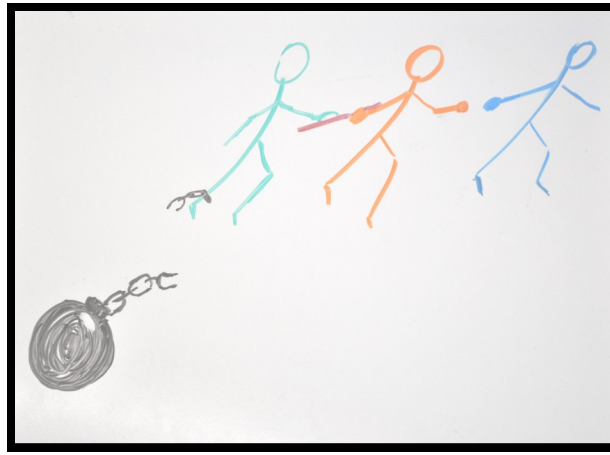
