

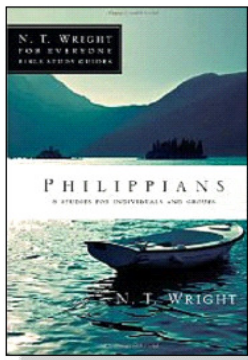


February is Women in Ministry Month at CBC

This month CBC will celebrate the voices of women in the pulpit as we host a different guest preacher each week. Each preacher will be using Jesus' own **Sermon on the Mount** as her text. Because each of these women finds herself in a quite different stage of faith and call we will be blessed with a variety of perspectives and understandings.

Week 1: Matthew 5:13-20, **Laura Tadlock, M.Div.**, is a Texan who now calls Central Virginia her home. Laura has ministry experience of her own, but for the past three years she has been supporting her husband Dale's call to ministry, and raising their two daughters. Laura is currently developing her skills in the field of Pastoral Care and Counseling.

Weeks 2 and 3: Matthew 5:21-37 and Matthew 5:38-48, **Kendall Ratliffe** and **Katie Boykin** are both students at Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond. Lent, It's a Very Visual Journey

Lent is a season of forty days which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent is a time to recall the sacrifice that Jesus made, giving up heaven to come to earth and share our sufferings, sins, and sorrow. In the end he gave up his life for us on the cross. Yes, he loved us to death.

Throughout the season you will see the story of Jesus' last week unfold using scripture and symbols to remind us of these important events.

Colors: earth colors of brown, gray, and black; pain colors of red and orange; and the traditional liturgical color of purple for penitence.

Textures: wood, stone, rough cloth or paper, ashes, sharp thorns and nails.

Remember, Sundays in Lent are always little Easters. The penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with joyful expectation of the Resurrection.

Beginning, Sunday, March 13, at 5:00 p.m. we will provide an opportunity for a time of reflection and study before the start of another work week. After a brief time of worship, prayer, and responsive readings, everyone is invited to Gillum Hall for a simple meal of bread and soup provided by Greenhouse Coffee. During the meal we will watch a video and afterwards gather for discussion.

Childcare will be provided and we will also provide transportation for those that are unable to drive in the evening. Please contact Deb in the church office so she can make the necessary arrangements.

Have you heard about the “Love Your Neighbor” thing? Well, of course you have....it is one of the basic Biblical principles but have you heard about CBC’s newest mission and community outreach project? If not, let us share with you how it works!

We have partnered with Crozet Elementary School to share food baskets (and so much more) with 18 families who needed temporary help in these difficult economic times. In order to fulfill the needs, we have rejuvenated the Food Pantry Ministry and relocated it down stairs beside the Life Fellowship Office.

In the midst of Advent Season on Sunday, December 12, we commissioned one another in this ministry and recognized the many years of faithful service to the Food Pantry Ministry by Betty Critzer and Patsy Rea.

The energy in the sanctuary was palpable and Holy as these two handed out reusable shopping bags conveniently printed with the CBC logo and the shopping list of basic items printed right on the front of the bag. At that time, we also ask for individuals or families to give prayerful consideration to serving as a “neighbor” from our church for period of six months. These “neighbors” will act as the point of contact for one of nine families as well as deliver bags of food, cleaning supplies, homemade items, and good old fashioned friendship on the 2nd Sunday of every month. The other nine families will pick up their groceries at the church.



So, how can you get involved?

1. If you would like to serve as one of the neighbors to deliver Food & Friendship contact Pat Gaertner at patgaertner@embarqmail.com.
2. Use your CBC shopping bag to purchase food or other products and bring your bag with you to the pantry when you come to church. Place the items right on the shelves if you don’t mind ... and keep your shopping bag to use next week.
3. Bring in fresh fruits, vegetables, and homemade meals or treats on the 2nd Sunday of every month. We do have a freezer in the pantry for any meals that can be frozen. **Please put dates on all perishable items.**
4. Bring in your paper grocery bags with handles if you have them. We will use those to pack and deliver the food every month
5. Participate in special drive events where we will collect specific items to fill the pantry.

February 13 Fresh fruit & veggies, homemade meals & treats
February 20 Super Suds Sunday (laundry detergent, cleaning supplies, paper products)
February 27 Toiletry items (toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, soap, deodorant)

Thank You to Henley Middle School and Mountainside Senior Living for partnering with us in our “Food and Fellowship” Ministry by providing us with food items for our pantry from Food drives.

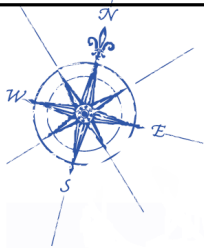
