

SOME EXAMPLES OF REFERENCING USING THE HARVARD AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM¹

Books

Basic format for books: Author's last (family) name, full first name (Year of publication) *Title of Book*, Place of publication: Publisher.

Edited (ed), revised (rev) or compiled (comp) book	Ehrenreich and Hochschild (eds 2003) question whether...	Ehrenreich, Barbara & Hochschild, Arlie (eds) (2003) <i>Global Woman: Nannies, Maids, and Sex Workers in the New Economy</i> , New York: Metropolitan Books.
Book with more than 3 authors	As suggested by Sandler et al (2002: 14)	Sandler, Martin; Coleman, Edward; Patton, James & Wackers, Frans (2002) <i>Diagnostic Nuclear Medicine</i> , Philadelphia: Lippincott Williams & Wilkins.
Book with no author	As shown in <i>Networking essentials plus</i> (2000)	<i>Networking essentials plus</i> (2000), Redmond, WA: Microsoft Press.
Book with no date	This has been emphasised by Seah (nd) when...	Seah, Ron (nd) <i>Micro-computer Applications</i> , Redmond: Microsoft Press.

Encyclopaedia or dictionary – no author	The Hutchinson Encyclopaedia (2001) defines ethics as...	No entry is required in the reference list because you have the name and date of the encyclopaedia or dictionary as in-text reference.

Journal articles

Basic format for journal articles: Author's last (family) name, author's full first name (Year of publication) "Title of the article", *Title of the Journal*, (volume) issue number: page range.

Journal article with single author	Agustin in her article states that (2002: 17)	Agustin, Laura (2004) "A Migrant World of Services", <i>Social Politics</i> , (10)3: 377-396.
Journal article with two or more authors	Erickson and Tewkesbury (2000: 271) acknowledge...	Erickson, David and Tewkesbury, Richard (2000) "The 'Gentlemen' in the Club: A Typology of Strip Club Patrons", <i>Deviant Behavior</i> , 21: 271-93.
Journal article with no author	Such a strategy is already in use ("Building Human Resources instead of Landfills" 2000) and...	"Building Human Resources instead of Landfills" (2000), <i>Biocycle</i> , (41) 12: 28-29.
Journal article from an electronic journal	As Lambevski observes (2003)...	Lambevski, Alexander (2003) "Habitus, Attitude, Boredom and the End of Enjoyment: A Profile of an 'A' List Homo", <i>borderlands e-journal</i> , (2)3, accessed on 2 December 2005, http://www.borderlandsejournal.adelaide.edu.au/vol2no3_2003/lambevski_enjoyment.htm .
