Lack of Clean Water: Cause of Disease in Haiti

The recent outbreak and spread of Cholera in Haiti has affected an estimated 650,000 people in Haiti, as reported this month by the UN.

Cholera is a potentially fatal bacterial infection, spread by ingestion of contaminated food or drinking water. The main cause is poor water quality and lack of adequate sanitation.

Around the world, nearly one billion people lack access to safe water, and their health is severely compromised as a result. The United Nations World Water Development Report states that almost one tenth of the global disease burden could be prevented by improving water supply, sanitation, hygiene, and management of water resources.

The United States maintains safe water supplies because of regulations and coordinated efforts of local, state, and federal agencies, and especially the work of **Licensed Plumbers and Certified Water Specialists**. Licensed Technicians are educated regarding the local, state, and federal regulations that will guarantee safety in your home.

Still, we should be aware of the possibility that contaminants can enter our water supply. Remember to review your town Water Quality Report, and have your water tested if you pull your water from a well. Although our water may not contain bacterial water-borne disease, contaminants can still have an adverse and long-term affect on our health.

Check Your Outdoor Faucets: If you haven't done so yet, we recommend that you take the hose off the sillcock outside your house. This prevents freezing, which can cause leaks once spring arrives and you want to use the hose.
