Since August of 2021, organizers and activists have been involved in an autonomous, decentralized movement to Stop Cop City. This includes those who were and are committed to Climate Justice and fighting environmental racism, as well as those committed to abolition and the deterioration of the prison industrial complex. The movement is made up of both Native Atlantans and others from far and wide (even across the ocean), who believe that life is more precious than money and that the environment dictates our quality of life. Engaging in a variety of tactics and promoting their plight on an international scale, the movement to Stop Cop City has endured. We have seen the murder of the first Environmental Justice Advocate (in U.S. history) at the hands of a Georgia State Trooper; 23 people charged with Domestic Terrorism and 61 people indicted on RICO charges. We have seen the arrest of the Sol Fund 3, who were arrested for running a legal bail fund that aided in legal defense of protestors. Most recently, we have seen the homes of vocal Stop Cop City activists raided and illegally searched, as well as the constant surveillance of active Stop Cop City organizers. Despite this unprecedented level of State Repression, the movement is still moving. The fight continues and the movement is still growing. We are committed to our land, we are committed to our people and we are committed to Stop Cop City. No Cop City here, no Cop City anywhere!
