This Sunday the Church celebrates Trinity Sunday. This feast follows Pentecost when the Holy Spirit was made fully known to the Church and is a celebration of the very life of God Himself who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. With Pentecost, the Lord has shared everything about Himself with us: "Through an utterly free decision, God has revealed himself and given himself to man. This he does by revealing the mystery, his plan of loving goodness, formed from all eternity in Christ, for the benefit of all men. God has fully revealed this plan by sending us his beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit." (Catechism #50) The reason that God fully reveals Himself to us is that He loves us and wants us to come to know Him, and not only know Him, but share fully in His life. Much more than just a complicated theological feast (although the Trinity is a divine mystery), today's celebration really is about God wanting us to come to know Him so that we might love Him. As you know, every good loving relationship requires self-disclosure, a readiness to reveal oneself, to make oneself vulnerable. How amazing it is that God has done this with us!

Congratulations to our 8th graders at OLPH school who graduated this past Friday. To them and to all of those who are taking significant steps in life, please know of our prayers for you that the Lord will help you to know His plan for your life and give you the grace to seek after it and say yes to all He has in store for you. 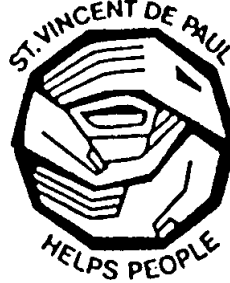


**OUR DAILY BREAD NEEDS VOLUNTEERS**
