Finance Committee is Seeking New Members



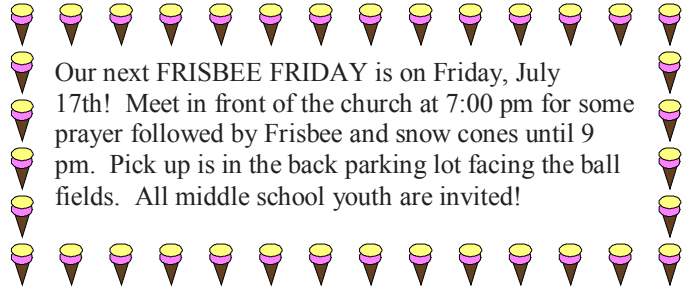
