

# Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association

MINUTES---2nd ANNUAL MEETING

MARCH 13, 1970

The second annual meeting of the I.H.S.B.C.A. was called to order at 8:40 p.m. by president Harold "Pinky" Primrose at Cedar Rapids Washington High School.

Mr. Primrose started by thanking the people involved in making the second annual clinic possible. He then followed by stating the progress that was made by the organization in its first year. Mr. Primrose emphasized that all of the members must spread the word of the organization to others and the importance of good publicity to improve the sport of baseball.

The minutes of the last general meeting and the last board meeting were approved as read.

Bernie Hutchinson gave the financial report and the organization has a balance of \$829.97 excluding the bills of the clinic.

Under committee reports, Elmer Starr chairman of the Hall of Fame committee, reported that the future Hall of Fame members be people that have coached in Iowa for at least ten years and be a member of the organization.

Byron Rhodes, chairman of the audit committee, reported that the books were in order. Ed McNeil moved to accept the audit. The motion was seconded by "Buck" Cheodle and carried.

Jim Jagum, chairman of public relations, started by saying that the members of the organization must promote the organization throughout the State.

"Pinky" Primrose then reported that the Board had accepted the 1970 calendar and the clinic dates of March 12 and 13, 1971. He also asked for recommendations for new clinic speakers.

Under new business Bill Freese introduced a change in the Constitution which will be presented in the newsletter before the next general meeting. The change is in Art. V, Sec. 1 and concerns the president's fee.

Bill Freese of the nomination committee reported that the committee was unanimously in favor of retaining the present officers. The primary reasons for this recommendation were because of the infancy of the organization and the location of the officers. Dick Wagoner moved to accept the recommendation of the committee in re-electing the officers for another year. The motion was seconded by "Buck" Cheodle and passed.

Bill Freese moved for adjournment at 9:37 p.m., Vern Bredeson seconded the motion, and the meeting was adjourned.

## MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING

MARCH 13, 1970

President "Pinky" Primrose called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. at Cedar Rapids Washington High School. The board members present were, Vern Bredeson, "Buck" Cheodle, Bill Freese, Dave Hoyt, Bernie Hutchinson, Jim Jagum, Bob Locker, Vince Myers, Dennis Olejnik, "Pinky" Primrose, Byron Rhodes, Lloyd Spier, Elmer Starr, "Cap" Timm, Anley Twedt, and Dick Wagoner.

The minutes of the two previous executive committee meetings were approved as read.

Bernie Hutchinson gave the treasurer's report stating the organization has a balance of \$ 829.97 not including the clinic income and expenses.

"Pinky" Primrose suggested that Bill Freese, of the Hall of Fame committee, write a list of qualifications for future Hall of Fame members. Nothing is currently written for qualifications.

Elmer Starr read the names of the nominees for the Coach of the Year award. He then moved that each board member place the candidate on a ballot in order of one to five. The coach with the lowest total score would be the winner and if the results were a tie, there would be more than one Coach of the Year. The motion was seconded by Jim Jagum and the motion passed.

"Pinky" Primrose gave the membership committee report and stated that the organization currently had 180 members. He said that he would like to reach a membership of 200 which means that much work is need by all of the members in the promotion of the association.

Mr. Primrose named the audit committee with Byron Rhodes as chairman and "Buck" Cheodle, Anley Twedt, and Dave Hoyt as the remaining members.

Mr. Primrose reviewed the achievements by the organization in its first year, and then made suggestions for the future. The suggestions for the future were the possibility of an executive secretary for the association, guidelines for coaches to strive for in their baseball program such as scoreboards and out-field fences, and the hiring of a photographer to take pictures of all members honored by the association. He then volunteered to have the next clinic in Cedar Rapids.

There was no old business to be discussed.

The first item under new business was a discussion of the length of the memberships and it was decided not to change them in any way.

Dick Wagoner reported that newspapers in some areas gave bad publicity about the selection of all district teams. He then moved that a ballot be sent to all coaches and a selection committee be made up of only members of the association. The motion was seconded by Byron Rhodes and passed.

Jim Jagum moved that the next clinic be held on March 12 and 13, 1971. The motion was seconded by Bernie Hutchinson. Motion carried.

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*\$10 per month*

Bernie Hutchinson moved the association pay the President or executive secretary \$10.00 per month for his services. The motion was seconded by "Buck" Cheodle. After much discussion the motion was passed. It was decided that the board had the right, by the Constitution, to set the fee of the President.

Bill Freese moved that the organization hire a photographer to take pictures of the new Hall of Fame members and the District Coaches of the Year at the annual clinics. Dick Wagoner seconded the motion and the motion passed.

It was moved by Bill Freese and seconded by Elmer Starr that a letter be sent to the State Board of Control, Bernie Saggau, and the press supporting the "good conduct rule". Motion carried.

Mr. Primrose moved that the association pay clinic speakers \$.20 per mile of travel and \$10.00 per session. The motion was seconded by Elmer Starr. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:50 p.m.

The next board meeting will be at 10:00 a.m. May 26, 1970, in Mason City.
