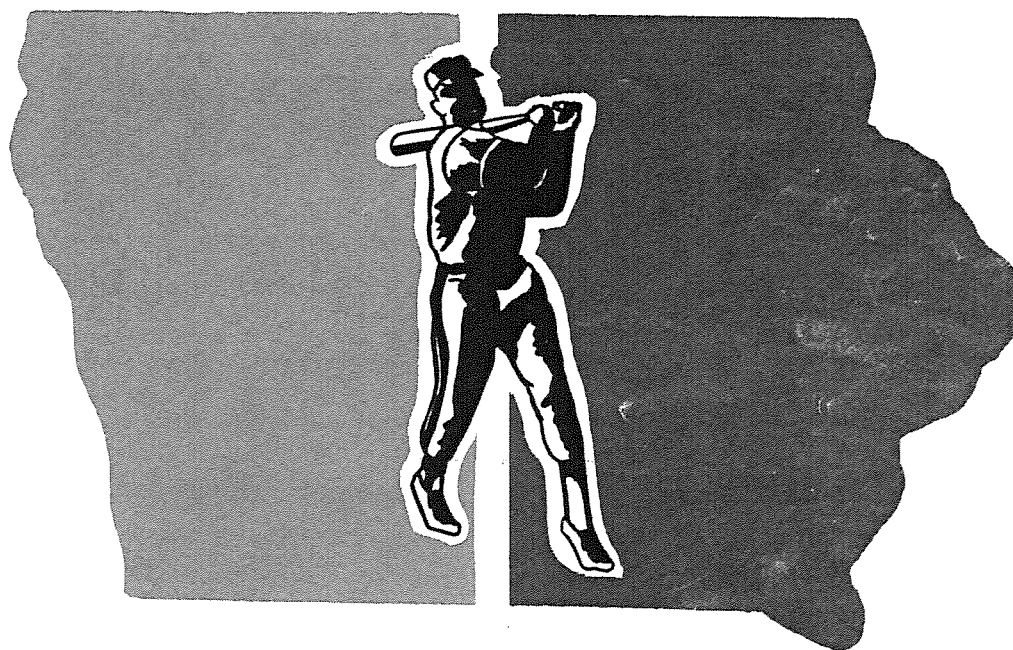

## 2A East stars top 1A West

AMES, Iowa (UPI) — Dubuque Hempstead's Tim Townsend surprised himself Sunday in the final game of the third annual Iowa Baseball Coaches Association All-Star Game.

Townsend blasted a three-run homer in the fourth to boost the East 2A All-Stars over the West 1A, 6-1.

The West 2A topped the East 1A, 2, in the consolation game at "Cap Timm Field.

Townsend, who is a .396 hitter from Dubuque Hempstead, smacked the ball over the leftfield fence driving in Brad McAreavy, Marion and Bill Kreckle, Burlington.

The homer broke a 1-1 tie and was Townsend's third of the season.

"I'm usually a linedrive hitter said Townsend who is heading toward the junior college ranks if he fails to play baseball and football.

The home run ball cleared the 30-foot marker over the leftfield fence although Townsend said he didn't think the ball would make it.

"I thought it might have been over his (the fielder's) head," Townsend said.

But all leftfielder Dick Stipe, Clarinda could do was watch the ball sail over the fence.

The East 2-A team had taken a 1-0 lead in the first inning when Tim Davis, of Waterloo scored on Jim Swank's sacrifice fly.

John Young, the pitcher for state champion Davenport Central and Scott Olberding, of Dyersville Beckman combined to pitch a five-hitter for the East 2A. Young was the winner, while Tony Schneider, Bancroft St. John's was the loser.

Townsend was named the East's most valuable player while Key Williams, of Ballard Huxley was selected as the West 1A's MVP.

Johnston's Jeff Cisna's double left in the third inning drove Williams for the West's only run.

Mason City's Scott Swensen scored in the East eighth inning from second on an error by the third baseman. Matt Thayer of Decorah hit a sharp line drive by the third baseman, allowing Swenson to score.
