**MEMBERSHIP DRIVE:** The membership drive is still on. We now have 154 members. This is 15 more than last year at this time. In 1969 we had 127 members in November. Our goal this year is 300, which is 50 more than last year's goal which we exceeded by 17. If you belong to a conference, write the coaches in your conference who are not members and encourage them to join the organization. Enclosed is a list of the schools that have belonged to the association since our beginning in 1968-69.

**REPRESENTATIVE BALLOT:** Enclosed you will find a voting ballot for your District Representative. Make sure you return it within ten days after you receive your ballot. We need your vote. Also enclosed (on the back of the District Representative ballot) you will find a ballot for the District Coach in your district. Select one coach IN YOUR DISTRICT who you feel deserves the District Coach of the Year Award. At the bottom you should vote for the College Coach of the year. One vote for the two-year college coach and one vote for the four-year college coach. The nominees were selected at the Board meeting in Iowa City October 16. The following priorities were used. He must be:

- 1/ An active member of the I.H.S.B.C.A.
- 2/ Nominated by fellow coaches of his district.
- 3/ In the state or district tournament with his team.
- 4/ Coaching for two years at the school he represents.
- 5/ A promoter of baseball in Iowa and for the organization.

The five district winners will be honored at the Baseball Clinic March 10-11, 1972. One of the five will be selected the Coach of the Year. The winners will be announced at our Clinic banquet. MAKE SURE YOU VOTE.

**FALL CHAMPS — GRANVILLE SPALDING:** Congratulations are in order for Jim Ellwanger and his Granville-Spalding baseball team for winning the fall championship. Coach Ellwanger will be a guest speaker at our clinic. Jim is an active member of the association.

**CLINIC MARCH 10-11:** The Clinic plans are proceeding on schedule. A committee meeting was held October 27 to set up the time schedules — topics — speakers for the clinic. We are going to have more seminar type sessions, called **MINI CLINICS** — four sessions going on at once. These sessions will be repeated the next day. The High School students will have sessions by themselves, with speakers just talking to them, demonstrating, etc. We hope to have more high school students in attendance. We hope you are making your plans to get the day off and join us in a top notch clinic for baseball coaches and fans. It is open to your ball team if they are interested in learning a lot of baseball. If you are a member of the association the clinic will be free. It will cost non-members \$10.00 to get into the clinic. High school students will be \$1.00 per session.

**ANOTHER SPEAKER HAS BEEN ADDED:** Frank Randall, Trainer at Iowa State University, will also be in attendance with the Iowa trainer. We hope this will improve our care of the injured ball player. Their topic will be CARE AND PREVENTION OF BASEBALL INJURIES.

**CONFERENCE STANDINGS:** A list of conference standings can be found in the newsletter. We would like for all Conferences throughout the state to send in their conference results. Congratulations to all the conference champions.

**MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING:** Enclosed you will find the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held in Iowa City October 16. Much was accomplished and the results will be better baseball in Iowa. We hope to honor all coaches who have served 15-20-25-30 years in the baseball coaching profession. Going to the class systems was discussed and tabled until the meeting in March. The length of the State Tournament series was discussed and tabled until the March meeting. There was a consensus that it should not go into August as it has over the past couple of years. Another topic to be discussed will be a three day state tournament compared to our present split state tournament. ## MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

IOWA CITY

OCTOBER 16, 1971

The meeting was called to order by President Elmer Starr (Mason City) at 10:10 a.m. The meeting was held at the University of Iowa. Board members present were: Gay Bowden (West Union - NE), Byron Rhodes (Beaman-Conrad - C), Nick Archer (S.C. Heelan - NW), Elmer Starr (Mason City - NE), Vern Bredeson (C. R. Jefferson - NE), Bill Freese (Davenport Central - SE), Pinky Primrose (C.R. Washington), Bob Locker (Des Moines Lincoln - C), Ray Randall (Iowa City West - SE), Jim Schultz (Bettendorf - SE), Jim Jagim (Des Moines Valley - C), Dick Wagner (Burlington - SE), Mick Mattiace (C. R. Prairie - NE). Guests representing groups: Ken Blackman (Hall of Fame), Duane Banks (Host), Rick Koolbeck (JUCO Colleges), Clair Rierson (College Coaches) and Buck Cheadle.

The minutes of the last board meeting and the last general meeting were approved as presented.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Pinky Primrose reviewed the financial situation since the clinic and reported a current balance of \$558.16. The report was accepted as read. Jim Schultz (Bettendorf) moved the financial report be approved as read. The motion was seconded by Dick Wagner (Burlington.)

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT:** President Elmer Starr expressed concern that more work has to be done by the association members to build up our membership for the coming year. He also reported about the Unified Coaches Association.

**EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT:** Pinky Primrose (C. R. Washington) recommended that a constitution change be made — that a District Representative can only serve two consecutive years of office — be removed. The constitutional committee will look into that recommendation. Primrose outlined the plans for next year's baseball clinic. A program committee will be meeting soon to outline the plans for the clinic. A motion was made by Vern Bredeson and seconded by Jim Schultz that the clinic go in the direction outlined to the Directors.

**ALL DISTRICT COACHES NOMINATIONS:** The All District Coaches nominees were selected. These coaches from each District were chosen by the Board of Directors present who voted by secret ballot.

**HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS:** The Hall of Fame nominees were listed and voted upon. The nominees chosen will be informed by letter and announced at a later date. They will be inducted into the Hall of Fame during the banquet March 10, 1972.

**NEW BUSINESS:** A motion was recommended by Dick Wagner that the 1972 State Baseball Tournament be held in Cedar Rapids. The motion was seconded by Nick Archer (S.C. Heelan). The Executive Board also recommended that the State Tournament remain in Cedar Rapids for the future. The board approved the motion.

**PINKY PRIMROSE MOVED THAT** any coach that has served 15, 20, 25, 30 years be honored at our Annual Banquet. This motion was seconded by Bill Freese (Davenport.) Passed.

Bill Freese moved that in the March general meeting consideration should be determined in possibly holding one baseball season tournament for the 1972-1973 season. The motion was seconded by Dick Wagner.

Permission was given to PERRY, WILLIAMSBURG, TWIN RIVERS BODE, and INDIANOLA to petition out of their districts. The motion was moved by the Board and seconded by Jim Jagim, to allow these schools to move to different districts.

It was suggested from the floor that the Fall, Spring, and Summer Tournaments be continued. Pinky Primrose suggested that a special meeting be set aside for the discussion of the topics raised.

The motion was made that the board meet Thursday night, March 9, at 7:30 at Cedar Rapids Washington, Friday morning 9:30-11:30 Committee meetings, and Friday at 12:30-2:00 a Board meeting.
