PRESIDENT MATTIACE SELECTED ON CLINIC STAFF IN MEXICO: Prairie High School paseball Coach Mick Mattiace was selected to put on a baseball clinic's in Puetbla, Mexico from August 2-10th. This program was sponsored by the Mexican Sports Federation. Coach Mattiace said the clinics were well attended by Coaches and students. Each day a different phase of baseball was covered at one of the baseball diamonds. The big difference Mick sees in Mexico's baseball programs and the United States program is that in the U.S. we have better coaches at the lower levels. Mexico has good facilities and great weather, but poor organization. These clinic's are an attempt to improve there programs. This year a total of 16 coaches from the United State put on clinics for over 3,000 people in Mexico.

Plan stiff penalty on misconduct by preps in baseball

The Iowa High School Athletic Association is preparing to take action against athletes who are ejected from summer baseball contests because of unsportsmanlike conduct.

Bernie Saggau, executive secretary of the organization, said Wednesday that a new rule, if passed by member schools, will bar players from competing in the next two contests following the infraction.

"We have no such rule now, and while it (unsportsmanlike conduct) is not a problem in our state, we don't want such a problem," Saggau said. "There are cases where players are being ejected and nothing is being done about it. We (the Board of Control of the IHSAA) don't believe this is right.

"There are getting to be more and more cases of kids slugging someone and some people think that is normal procedure. If boys know they will be out for two contests, they will think twice before they act."

Saggau said the voting forms would go out to member schools next spring after baseball rules meetings. If approved, the rule will go into effect next June 1, he added.

Saggau said the board discussed applying the rule to other sports, but no action was taken.

Baseball coaches who are ejected or walk off the field also may face stricter rules.

"We have decided that this will be a topic at our baseball rules clinics next spring," said Saggau. "We will draw up some strict guidelines for coaches to follow."

NOMINATION BALLOT FOR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2. Board of Directors. (A) The representatives to the Board of Directors shall be elected by the members within their district. By October 15 of each year, the association members will receive an official blank nomination ballot. Upon voting, the nomination ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive secretary. In the presence of two other association members, there shall be a canvass of the ballots. The 3 receiving the highest number of votes shall be considered the nominees. In case of a tie of more than 3, all those in the ties shall be considered nominees. In case the number of nomination ballots for any one of the nominees is a majority of the number of members in the respective district, he shall be declared elected. The executive secretary shall prepare and mail official election ballots to the members of the district. Upon voting, the election ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive secretary. The procedure in canvassing shall be the same as in canvassing nomination ballots and the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In case of a tie, the election shall be decided by lot by the candidates in the presence of the canvassing committee. The third highest vote getter shall be considered the alternate and in event of inability of elected Director to serve alternate will be appointed to the Board of Directors.

Please nominate two coaches from your district who are members of the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association to be members of the Board of Directors to represent your district.


