CLINIC MARCH 10 & 11: The 1978 Clinic tentative lineup is enclosed. We feel it is another top notch clinic. We hope you are planning to get the day off and join us for another super clinic. SUPER CLINIC SPEAKER LINE-UP:

DINNER SPEAKER: Vernon "Lefty" Gomez, Elected to Baseball's Hall of Fame in 1972, Lefty Gomez, now a veteran of a second career which started in 1948, Lefty more frequently relies on a verbal "change of pace" in his role of good-will ambassador for baseball. Lefty was the winning pitcher in three of the five All-Star games in which he appeared. He now travels under the banner of Wilson Sporting Goods Co., travels more than 100,000 miles annually promoting baseball at all levels.

BILL "MOOSE" SKOWRON: Fourteen years in the big leagues with the Yankee, Dodgers, White Sox, Washington, Angeles. Bill played in eight World Series with the Yankees and Dodgers. He had a life time average of .282 batting .319 in 1955. Bill hit 211 Home Runs in the big leagues. Bill retired from baseball in 1967. Presently he is with the Litton Financial Printing Co. or Naperville, Ill.

JERRY LUMPY: Started his professional baseball career in 1951. Jerry played 12 years in the Major Leagues with the Yankees, Kansas City Athletics, and Detroit Tigers. Jerry was a good glove man, played second base. His best year was in 1962 with a .301 batting average; his lifetime average was .268. He played in the 1957 and 58 World Series. Jerry coached the Mets Minor League infielders, and in 1971 was the Oakland A's first base coach. He is presently selling insurance in Springfield, Missouri and also is a co owner of the Shone-Me baseball tryout camp.

LINDY McDANIEL: Fourteen years in the big leagues with the St. Louis Cardinals, Chicago Cubs, San Francisco Giants and the Yankees in 1968. Lindy established himself as one of the great relief pitchers in the game. Lindy's overall Major League record is 101-86. He pitched in 668 games, striking out 954. He ranks fourth in All-time saves with 122. Lindy retired from baseball in 1968. He presently is running a religious book store in Kansas City.

RON OESTRIKE: Baseball Coach at Eastern Michigan University. Ron's teams have won two Mid-American Conference championships and fifth and second place finishes in the NCAA College World Series in 1975 and 76. Ron has given many clinic throughout the country, and is rated as an outstanding college coach and clinician.

LARRY WALLIN: Signed in 1965 out of the Midwest Collegiate Summer League. He led the league in Home Runs, R.B.I.'s and fourth in average. Larry signed with the New York Mets and played five years in the Met Organization. Larry made it to the Big Leagues in 1968. He was traded to the Indians in 1971. He spent all Spring backing up Ray Fosse. In 1972 he was sold to the Baltimore organization. Larry retired at the end of the 1972 season due to recurring injuries. Presently with Herff Jones Co. representing Eastern Iowa servicing High School & College graduate needs.

DICK BIRMINGHAM: High School Baseball Coach of Hillcrest High School of Springfield, Mo.. Seventeen years as High School Coach and 20 years a Legion coach. Dick's High School record is 197-79 and Legion record of 546-275. Overall record of 743 wins and 354 losses. Twelve Conference championships in 17 years. Third in Missouri State tournament four times. In 1966 had 6 players drafted off his team. In 1971 4 were drafted and remainder attended college on full baseball scholarship.

I need this information before the brochure goes to the printer.

200 PLUS VICTORIES: Did you reach a victory milestone last season? If you surpassed 200-300-400-500 wins, please send in your name and your record to the Executive Secretary. We would like to print the names of those coaches who have achieved this milestone. Coaches will receive a certificate for this accomplishment at the Tenth Annual Clinc March 10-11, 1978.

ANNUAL A.A.C.B.C. MEETING AND CLINIC: This will be held in Altanta, Georgia Thursday January 5, through Sunday January 8th. The convention will be held in the Marriott Hotel. This is the 33rd annual meeting of the A.A.C. B.C.. Send your dues to Les Miller, Baseball Coach, Chicago Circle, Chicago, Ill. Membership dues for the A.A.C.B.C. are \$10.00 for high school coaches who now have full membership. NEW IDEAS IN BASEBALL: Dave Scott, Baseball Coach at Florida College, Temple Terrace, Florida put together some Effective Gimmicks in Coaching Baseball. These gimmicks can be used by coaches at all levels to further enchance the instruction process.

- 1. Striped ball-for use by pitchers (or hitters) to see the rotation.
- 2. Sain Spinner-to aid pitchers in getting the proper rotation.
- 3. Zip Curveball Trainer-to aid pitchers in getting the proper rotation.
- 4. Catchers's Mitt with White Target Area-to increase pitching control.
- 5. Glove on a Bat-for use in teaching bunting techniques.
- 6. Eye patches-to aid in increasing the acuity of hitters picking up the ball with their non-dominant eye.
- 7. Batting Tee-For hitting instruction
- 8. Isometric Bat and Ball-to increase strength for hitting & throwing.
- 9. Wooden Glove-to instruct fielders in using both hands.
- 10.Blocking Dummy-to aid infielders in overcoming the distraction of a sliding runner when making a double play.
- 11. Major League Breaking Ball--to help increas your batting average and confidence at the plate.

The President Comments:

Through these comments I hope that I can instill others to send their thoughts into "Pinky" for dissemination through the Newsletter.

First of all a sincere "thank you" to all the Association Directors and Officers for their attendance at the fall meeting and the direction they are giving the Association. There were many ideas that will require follow-up effort, which you can read in the Association Minutes and I will comment on here.

Each member is arged to contact one or more baseball coach and/or fan to get them to join this Association. Membership is our life line.

The question of having baseball tournament play in three classes was brought up at the Directors meeting. We should address ourselves to this question at our March Clinic. In the September 1976 IHSAA Bulletin #377 there was a potential breakdown on how many schools there would be in a three class set-up. This can be found on page 76.

"Pinky" and his Clinic Committee are getting a great clinic together with some outstanding speakers. I do hope that those coaches from Iowa that are asked to host a mini-clinic will be prepared to act as a back-up instructor and if asked to be a main platform speaker present some "meaty" baseball material.

At present we are not restricted in the number of baseball games that can be played in a summer season by the Iowa High School Athletic Association, but there seems to be pressure directed toward that end. At this writting I feel we are in a holding pattern hopefully to get feed back from all sides before any decision is made. personal feelings are that the number of games should be left up to each school or school district. Things that have been brought up as possible reasons for restricting the number of games are: energy crisis; not enough time to practice with a large schedule; lack of pitching; no time for boys to be boys; Title IX implications regarding balancing schedules and there are probably others. Associations Steering Committee has been given the responsibility to gather information so that we can address ourselves to this question. I urge all of you to contact your administration to seek their opinion as well as expressing yours and to urge that no be made by the Board of Control until all sides have been heard.

I regret to announce that Dean Witmer will no longer be coaching baseball at Perry and has requested he be removed as Membership Committee chaiman. I have received Joel Franken's O.K. for him to be the Membership Chairman. I congratulate Dean for a tremendous job and for leaving this most important position in such good hands.

Minutes of the March 10, 1077 Board of Directors meeting were approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Financial report was presented by Harold Primrose, Executive Secretary. The report showed a balance in the checking account of \$1,952.73. The Pass Book Savings Account showed a balance of \$1600.00.

- 6. Mentioned his concern about possibility of a limitation of number of games a team could play during the summer.
- 7. Suggested a breakfast sponsored by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes as a possibility at our Spring Clinic.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARIES REPORT:

- 1. Exec. Sec. Pinky Primrose reported that the newsletter would be in the mail Monday.
- 2. Commenting on coaches getting a list of high school baseball coaches, Pinky said "the new high school directory would be a good source".
- 3. Pinky presented a new designated hitting rule that the Indiana coaches experimented with last year.

Commented on letters received from 3-4 different sources on moving the summer state baseball tournament to a different site. Suggested that Tom Strode receive the contributors award

for his help with the All-Star baseball series.

Pinky needs help on the longevity award.

Asked coaches to get in Board of Directors nominations and question sheet.

ALL-STAR GAME COMMITTEE: Dave Posegate reported that the All-Star series was a big success. Financially there is \$1000 left for next years series. Jim Ellwanger will be chairman for the 1978 All-Star The games will be in Iowa City.

RATING POLL COMMITTEE: Bob Watson reported that the procedure worked good last year and will be followed again in 1978.

STEERING COMMITTEE: NO REPORT

PROGRAM COMMITTEE: Many ideas were discussed. it was decided the district meeting on Friday night will continue. It was mentioned that the host during the mini-clinics could take a more active role.

The Indiana DH rule was discussed. Pinky Primrose moved we send a letter to the association in Indiana saying we favor the proposal. Ron Welsch seconded - Passed.

The development of a booklet containing past history of the association was discussed. It was decided that the steering committee would study this.


The calendar for the remainder of the year was approved.

THE RUN DOWN PLAY

There are several good rules to follow in making this play. The most important is: RUN THE RUNNER BACK TO THE BAG FROM WHICH HE CAME.

- 1. Try to start this play when the runner is half-way between the bases.
- 2. Give the ball to the forward man, and let him run the runner back to the bag from which he came.
- 3. The forward man should run hard at the runner, but not with a faking motion of the arm.
- 4. The tagger should stay in front of his bag, and inside the base line. This will give him the proper angle of the throw.
- 5. When the runner is about ten feet from the tagger, the tagger should make a BREAK toward the runner. This is the sign to the thrower to give the tagger the ball on his first step.
- 6. The thrower makes an easy, chest-high toss.
- 7. When play is worked right, one throw is all that is needed to get the runner at any base.
- 8. The man without the ball must avoid interfering with the runner.

RULES TO REMEMBER...

- 1. Run the runner back to the bag from which he came.
- 2. Run the runner hard.
- 3. The tagger and the thrower stay inside the base line.
- 4. The tagger must stay in front of his bag until making his break.
- 5. The thrower should make an easy, chest-high toss...not a quick, hard throw.
