# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE ATHLETIC DIRECTORS ADVISORY COMMITTEE WITH THE I.H.S.A.A.

Tuesday, June 6, 1978

The Athletic Directors Advisory Committee met in the Association Office, Boone, Iowa, Tuesday, June 6, 1978 at 10 a.m. Members present were Rollin Dyer, Atlantic; Dr. Warren Bowlus, Davenport; Bill Cook, Spencer; Fred Smith, Ankeny; Jason Church, Hudson; Howard Stutzman. Boone; and Paul Stoppels, Linn-Mar, Marion. Also in attendance were Bernie Saggau, Executive Secretary, and David Harty, Assistant Executive Secretary, of the I.H.S.A.A.

actually participate in the indoor activities. The committee reviewed results of the questionnaire relative to number of baseball games desired, considered the length of the season and the fact that school is not in session, thus not a loss of school time. Additionally, Mr. Harty reviewed with the committee the Baseball Coaches Advisory Committee recommendation should there be a necessity for contest limitation. Considerable discussion was generated with regard to the number of games versus playing dates. After discussion it was unanimously recommended that high school summer baseball practice be permitted to start on the first Monday in May and to include twenty-five playing dates with no loss of school time involved for any contest played when school is in session. Additionally, the committee unanimously recommended the elimination of the playing of spring baseball after a two year period. By definition, spring baseball is any high school baseball practice and/or contest played prior to the first Monday in May.

Baseball: The Board reviewed the October 10, 1977, Baseball Coaches Advisory Committee minutes noting that the Advisory Committee did not have any specific recommendations other than to review the baseball program involving items of contest limitations, alcohol on the premises by spectators, consideration for standardizing the uniform color for umpires and review of the State Tournament format with eight teams coming in to the final site in each class with the possibility of playing the first round out in the area of the state and semifinalists and finalists coming in to a central site for completion of the State Tournament. After review of the committee's minutes, it was noted that contest limitations have been discussed at some length by the Board of Control and Representative Council at a previous meeting with no action taken and that the format for the State Baseball Tournament series had already been changed to include first-round activity out in the area of the state. The Board did adopt the following policy as it pertains to the use of tobacco as reports in the last two or three years have increased relative to the use of tobacco (principally that of chewing) by coaches as well as players and smoking on the premises by some coaches. It was moved by Yates, seconded by Sweet and adopted, that there shall be no use of tobacco by players or coaches in all sport programs. In reference to alcohol on the premises at high school athletic events, the Board informed the executive staff of the state law prohibiting alcoholic beverages on school premises and that in future communication instructed the Executive Staff to advise all school administrators of same and the desire of the lowa High School Athletic Association's wishes for their cooperation in adhering to the state law as it relates to junior-senior high school athletic programs.

#### NOMINATION BALLOT FOR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2. Board of Directors. (A) The representatives to the Board of Directors shall be elected by the members within their district. By October 15 of each year, the association members will receive an official blank nomination ballot. Upon voting, the nomination ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive secretary. In the presence of two other association members, there shall be a canvass of the ballots. The 3 receiving the highest number of votes shall be considered the nominees. In case of a tie of more than 3, all those in the ties shall be considered nominees. In case the number of nomination ballots for any one of the nominees is a majority of the number of members in the respective district, he shall be declared elected. The executive secretary shall prepare and mail official election ballots to the members of the district. Upon voting, the election ballot to be returned (within ten days from mailing) to the executive secretary. The procedure in canvassing shall be the same as in canvassing nomination ballots and the person receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In case of a tie, the election shall be decided by lot by the candidates in the presence of the canvassing committee. The third highest vote getter shall be considered the alternate and in event of inability of elected Director to serve alternate will be appointed to the Board of Directors
