ADMINISTRATIVE TEAM

The Administrative team had a busy first quarter in 2024:

We initiated the concept of paying off the mortgage as a means to address our cash flow problem. The campaign was started in February and as of March 19, we have had generous donations totaling over \$34,000. Our mortgage balance is around \$60,000.

The team has recommended to the session that we consider replacing all of the wooden doors in the sanctuary with updated fire safety doors. The team continues to be conscious of and monitor congregational safety during Sunday services.

DISCIPLESHIP TEAM

How's Your Prayer Life?

In the Christian church, important discipleship disciplines include: worship, studying scripture, prayer, service, stewardship, and fellowship. In past articles, I've written about study, service, and stewardship. At Grace, we do a pretty good job with fellowship with after worship refreshments, the annual picnic, and the various luncheons held throughout the year. As a group, we like to eat. Our worship services strive to glorify God with song, scripture, preaching, and prayer. Many of us give of our time in service to others.

What about personal prayer though? Do you pray on a regular basis other than during worship? Have you thought about your personal prayer life lately?

Prayer is a direct line of communication with God. In prayer, we lay our hearts before God and seek Him in humility and praise. Prayer aligns our hearts with God's purposes. It helps us seek His guidance in things big and small. We pray for His will to be done. Through prayer, we become more aware of God's constant companionship. Experiencing Him leads to awe, strengthens our faith, and encourages deeper trust. When we pray for others, we prioritize their needs over our own, recognizing that God is the center of the universe, not us.

The Bible assures us that God hears our prayers. In 1 John 5:14, it says, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us." God's faithfulness means that He cannot ignore our heartfelt cries. God's timing and perspective are different from ours. He may not always act immediately, or on our timeline, but He does act according to His plan.

If you don't already, find a quiet time during each day to pray. It doesn't have to be long or eloquent. The pattern of daily prayer connects us with centuries of Christian tradition and Jesus' own practices. Daily prayer serves as a bridge between public worship and personal affairs, helping us to live out our faith each day. If you find it helpful, use the ACTS model to form your prayer:

- Adoration: Begin by praising God for who He is—His character, love, and awesome majesty.
- Confession: Acknowledge your shortcomings and seek forgiveness.
- Thanksgiving: Express gratitude for blessings, both big and small.
- Supplication: Present your requests and intercede for others. Pray for our church, our leaders, our family, friends, and our enemies.

After praying, listen to your heart. God responds to genuine intent and sincere hearts. He engages with faith. In your seeking, trust that God cares deeply for you. Keep praying, seeking wisdom, and remain open to His guidance. Remember, you are never alone in your journey of faith.

Joey and I were coming out of Kroger last week when we happened to find a wallet on the ground. "Someone lost their wallet" I said. "We should try to get it back to them" replied Joey.

Maybe it was his...Maybe it was hers... Maybe just theirs. How important are pronouns?

I have had the good fortune to learn firsthand about the LGBTQ + community. My firstborn, Katie, is queer, non-binary, and uses they/them pronouns. After 30 years of she/her, the pronouns have certainly been a learning curve. But you know what? I am a better parent and person for the lessons I have learned since our journey began. Native American cultures venerate a "two-spirit" child, something they have accepted and acknowledged throughout their history. What you see depends on how you decide to see it.

My child is exceptional in so many ways. After graduating from The Savannah College of Art and Design they were off to the Big Apple

where they founded their company, The Handy Ma'am. www.handymaam.nyc has been featured in the Huffington Post, The New York Times and most recently in this month's AARP magazine. As a parent, they give me a lot of bragging rights. Far and away my greatest pride in their accomplishments is the way they respect every person they meet. They ask questions we are too timid to ask. Not out of curiosity, but out of respect.

Respect.
So simple to give, so lovely to receive.

One of the young people in our church recently pointed me in the direction of The Trevor Project. The Trevor Project (www.thetrevorproject.org) is a resource for at-risk LGBTQ+ youth navigating their place in the world when it doesn't feel like a place exists for them. Helplessness, Suicide. Resources. Advocates. Education. Information and resources for parents. The work they do is immeasurably important to families in our community and in our church.

Social Justice at Grace Presbyterian is social justice for everyone. Our members, our visitors, the parents.... We are all out there sitting with you every week and I know that our little church has understanding enough for whatever the Lord puts in our path.


