

First Things First...

Then Noah built an altar to the Lord and took some of every clean animal and some of every clean bird and offered burnt offerings on the altar. Genesis 8:20

The act of worship involving the sacrifice of an animal extends back through the generations of humanity, all the way to Cain and Abel. However, Genesis 8: 20 is the first recorded act of worship in which the worshipper, in this instance Noah, built an altar for the sacrifice. There are at least twenty-seven cases (in the English Standard Version) specifically mentioning the building of an altar. Most of these accounts document the work of an individual in thankful response to a blessing from God.

Meditating on this verse, I was struck by what some may consider an abstract interpretation or as some might say is one of my favorite activities, chasing down another rabbit trail. This is the thought that occurred: whenever an individual built an altar, it took time. Exiting from the ark's voyage of at least a year, the first activity of Noah was to build an altar. While we're not provided elaborate or intricate details of these early structures, they nonetheless served the purpose of providing God with delightful BBQ. Verse 21 reveals: "And when the Lord smelled the pleasing aroma..." Certainly, God did not NEED the food. But the love expressed in the giving, in taking the time to recognize the Lord for his gifts of love lead to future blessings. Verse 21 continues: ... The Lord said in his heart, "I will never again curse the ground because of man, for the intention of man's heart is evil from his youth. Neither will I ever again strike down every living creature as I have done. While the earth remains, seed time and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease." Blessings upon future blessings poured out because one man, one person, made the time to offer thankful worship to the Lord.

Again, on the fourth Thursday of November our nation will observe a national holiday called Thanksgiving Day. To some people it will be simply another day. Some people will move from the football games on television to engorge themselves on the day's feast and then they will return to their games. Some people will pause for the first time this year and say an abbreviated prayer of thankfulness to the God of blessings. For most people who identify as

Christians, these will pause and for the umpteenth time worship in thankful prayer and praise. Very likely, these latter ones are the ones who realize their daily blessings from God our Father. These latter ones are those who realize that the Lord's salvation is freely and abundantly theirs every day. These latter ones are they who most likely gather with fellow believers on a regular basis to praise, to worship, to hear the Lord's Word on Sunday mornings as frequently as they are able. Recognizing that God's faithfulness is renewed every morning, they respond by taking the time, by making the time to build an altar of worshipful thanksgiving for the forgiveness of their sins and for the hope of eternal life. When Christians take and make the time to worship publicly and corporately, they are giving of their time to build altars of thanksgiving even as did Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses and so many others who are our ancestors in faith.


Will you take the time to build an altar of thanks to the Lord next Sunday?






Annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner
