WHAT'S YOUR STORY?

Think of sharing your testimony in these ways:

Everyone's testimony is unique. Every person's testimony of accepting Christ as his or her Savior and how God has changed his or her life is different. Your story will be unlike anyone else's, and that is a good thing. This demonstrates Jesus is a personal God. He meets us where we are, draws us to Himself in various ways, and works in our life. He strengthens and equips us to grow and serve Him in a way uniquely chosen for us.

God prepares the heart of the recipient. When God leads you to share your testimony with someone, He has already begun working in that person's life. I told my story to a relative, and she was interested and open to how the Lord had saved me. Christ had already prepared her heart to hear. We have more courage and peace when we remember God goes before us.

A testimony contains 3 parts: life before Christ, one's salvation experience, and life after accepting Christ. If you became a believer at a young age, the part before Christ may be short. Many people may not relate to growing up in a Christian home. If you became a Christian later in life, sharing a few details is helpful, but use discretion. Salvation experiences need to include an admission of sin, a belief that Christ is the Son of God who can save us from sin, and a prayer of commitment. It's important to share how God has impacted our life since salvation, which hasn't been an easy road, and God forgives and loves us in spite of ourselves and to His glory.

Call for a response. Ask the person if he or she wants to make a decision for Christ. Assure that person of God's love, forgiveness, and power to change his or her life if that is a concern. Encourage a new believer to share his or her decision with others. Plug new believers into a small group or church to help their faith grow.
