MINISTER'S CORNER



Dear Friends:

It's May, and one of the busiest times of the church year for pastors is now over. As much as I enjoy the Lenten season, Holy Week and Easter, when it's over and the pace begins to slow down a bit I take a deep breath and ponder how all the activities went and how I might improve things and do a better job next year. Thank you for your support, understanding and empathy during that very hectic time.

As I think about the various seasons of the Church year and how they allow us to journey along with and experience the life of Jesus, I also thought about the seasons and stages of life that we go through as human beings. And I rediscovered a humorous story that offers a smile-inducing "explanation" of why human beings go through the phases of life they go through. Enjoy!

God created the mule, and told it, "You are mule. You will work constantly from dusk to dawn, carrying heavy loads on your back. You will eat grass and lack intelligence. You will live for fifty years."

Ronald B. Corn shares the following experience.

“In our church, at the end of each Sunday service, the congregation sings and applauds as the children file into the sanctuary to take their place up front. There are children from different ethnic groups gathered together, laughing and enjoying one another. When I see this activity it reminds me of an incident from many years ago.

Walt Augustine was an African-American co-worker from Chicago who often visited our office in Kansas City. One day a group of us was discussing some of life’s challenges. Walt shared with us that his six-year-old son, James, had talked many times about Michael, his playmate at school. One day Walt asked James if Michael was black. His son looked at him in a very puzzled way and replied, “I don’t know. I’ll have to look.”

This story always reminds me of how God wants us to live our lives—void of prejudices and accepting of one another with our differences, just as Walt’s son James did.

Annual Meeting Notice – Absentee/Proxy Voting

Do you have a schedule conflict with the May 5 Annual Meeting of Church membership this year? There is good news — you can still vote when not physically present at the meeting! Another church member can be designated as your delegate to vote on your behalf at the meeting, or you can choose to assign your vote to the Moderator and/or ministries that are sponsoring an Article, meeting minutes, or an annual meeting proposal.



All you need to do is complete the PROXY form that can be obtained by visiting or contacting the Church office. The completed form must be physically delivered, faxed, or postal mailed (e-mail's cannot be accepted) no later than Thursday, May 2. Please contact the Church office with questions.



This is an all out plea to the congregation. We need people to PLEASE sign up for a one year only commitment to one of our ministries. Some of these ministries meet right after the church service and meet once a month, and you are not required to make every meeting! The Members, Friends & Church Life Ministry is tasked each year with nominating people for each ministry. This year we are finding ourselves short of 22 open positions.

Please consider, even if you have served before or are on another committee, to join one of the following:

Ministry of Worship & Spiritual Care - Manages everything to do with all worship services, recruiting ushers, pastor relations, flowers, music, etc. - need 8 more people.

We are also looking for: 2 - Council At-Large, 1 Moderator, and 3 needed for the Ministry of Audit and a Sunday School Superintendent.

Please give this some prayerful thought to help as a volunteer for one or more positions. This truly is doing God's work and is very rewarding.
