MINISTER'S CORNER

Dear Friends,



Can something good come out of suffering and pain? What do you think?

When Robert Greene was 37-years old, he was driving home late one night and was hit head-on by a car that careened off the road and collided into his car. As a result he spent the next 54 weeks in the hospital, and now for the rest of his life he will have to deal with significant pain. But in spite of his suffering, he wrote this in a letter to his mother.

"I would like to express what I have been thankful about . . . First, I am thankful for my ability to express myself . . .

"Second, I can see. True, I see double, but some will say that is twice as good as before, and it is a lot better than half as good. I could be blind. But even if I were blind, at least I could feel.

"Third, I have good strength in my arms. This helps me move in my wheelchair and helps me walk with crutches.

"Fourth, I can bear weight on my legs . . . I am lucky to still have them, and it is nothing short of a miracle that I can walk at all

"Fifth, I am alive at a time and in a society where a sizable investment in health care has been made...

"Sixth, nearly everything I have experienced since the accident has been of value and support to me, and has helped me become a better person

"Seventh, I give thanks to my brother for his friendship.

"Eighth, I give thanks to my wife for all the happiness and tears we have known together.

"Ninth, I am grateful to my children, Rebecca and Kiersten, for the joy and richness they have brought to my life.

"Tenth, I am thankful for the future, for it holds not a promise, but a challenge and an opportunity.

"I have not lost sight of the fact that I have had a serious misfortune. I would not wish it on anyone. But starting from ground zero, and assuming that like everyone else I am entitled to nothing, the fact that I am experiencing anything positive is a plus. And I have enjoyed more pluses than minuses, thanks be to God."

My friends, I believe thankfulness isn't just a feeling that is generated in us when we experience something positive, but it is also (and perhaps it is mostly) a <u>choice</u> we make to find something positive to be grateful for, especially when we have a negative experience. Perhaps this Thanksgiving, even if we have had a difficult year, we can do what Robert Greene did and make a list of ten things we are thankful about. If we can't come up with ten things, how about five? And if not five, perhaps we can think of at least one thing we are grateful for. Because having even one thing we are thankful about gives us reason to exclaim, "Thanks be to God!"

May Thanksgiving Day be a blessed and joyous occasion for you and your loved ones, and an opportunity to give thanks for the blessings God has bestowed on you.



AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

The church has acquired an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) that is mounted on the Vestry wall near the restroom. The AED is an easy-to-use medical device that helps those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It analyzes the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, delivers an electric shock to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.
