## A LETTER TO THE CONGREGATION FROM THE MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND SPIRITUAL CARE

Dear members and friends of the First Congregational Church of Scarborough:

After over a year, it was a joyous occasion when the doors of our little white church were re-opened and we all gathered together to worship in person again! Some in the congregation have asked why we didn't reopen sooner. We want you to know that during the time our church was closed, the Ministry of Worship and Spiritual Care met monthly to discuss COVID-19 and how it was affecting our church family. Throughout those months of prayerful conversation, we kept an eye on the number of coronavirus infections and deaths in Maine, listened to the recommendations of the CDC and other experts, and reviewed State guidelines. All of those things guided our judgment and led us to believe that it was God's will and in the best interest of our congregation to keep people safe by remaining closed.

This was a very difficult decision to make, and the Ministry did not take it lightly. While Rev. Gagnon was at our meetings and he agreed that it would be for the best, he did not make the decision to remain closed on his own. In fact, he mentioned more than once that he did not want to make such an important decision by himself and needed the input of the Ministry of Worship and Spiritual Care. On a couple of occasions during the pandemic he polled people who attended Zoom worship services about whether or not to reopen, and he also brought the issue before the Ministry of Governing and Finances. Almost everyone he asked told him it was best that we remain closed for the time being and continue to monitor the situation regularly.

After what felt like an eternity to all of us, in April of this year the Ministry felt that, with most people being vaccinated and COVID-19 cases on the decline, it was safe to resume in-person services; and in May our doors were opened wide to welcome everyone back to church. While things still aren't the way they used to be, the Ministry is continuing to work towards getting our services back to "normal" as quickly as possible.

The Ministry of Worship and Spiritual Care would like to thank the congregation for their patience, understanding and support during these past months. Now it is time for us to come together and build up our church. With the help of the Holy Spirit and our members and friends, we will grow healthy and strong once more. We hope you will join us as we work to make the First Congregational Church of Scarborough thrive again.

## **GOVERNING & FINANCES UPDATE**

As you may know the First Congregational Church's fiscal and budget year begins in July, so "Happy New Fiscal Year" to the Members and Friends of the church.

We finished up the 2020-2021 fiscal year in relatively good financial shape thanks to the continued financial support of the congregation during the Pandemic, including some unplanned gifting. Those of you who stayed after the Church service of August 8th heard us deliver our next Quarterly Financial Update in more detail.

Some unfortunate news is that the computer used by the Treasurer recently had a severe failure requiring several days to recover. It is working now, but the computers used by the Treasurer, Recording Treasurer and Pastor are all at least six years old with outdated operating systems and are having more frequent issues. We feel it is prudent to replace these computers as soon as possible which will require an unbudgeted expenditure of about \$2,800, which we hope to raise from donations. Would you be willing to contribute to this cause? If so, donations can be mailed or dropped off at the church office or placed in to the offering plate at service. Please make sure to note that your gift is specifically for "computer replacement" on checks or other correspondence..
