After a break due to the COVID pandemic, the John Libby Family Association returned to the Parish Hall to hold their annual reunion on September 24. After passing the hat, the Association raised \$809.00 which was donated to the church.

Be a Part of Helping the Homeless

Greetings to you all from the Ministry of Stewardship and Outreach. As we enter the holiday period, our Ministry of Outreach looks at various charities to receive our Special Thanksgiving and Christmas offerings. This year's Special Thanksgiving Offering is being direct to Elena's Way in Portland.

Elena's Way is a new shelter for the homeless located where the Preble Street Resource Center was. "For 27 years, 5 Portland Street served as the Preble Street Resource Center where thousands of people found support and a hand up when they needed it most. Now, at this new Wellness Shelter, people will continue to find opportunity and hope."

The building has been renovated and repurposed as a shelter for 40 people who are homeless and who have complex health and behavioral issues calling for a new form of shelter. Elena's Way will provide housing, warmth and safety, meals, medical and counseling services, all of this in one location. Occupants of the shelter will not have to wait outside for entry each night or leave in the morning. They will not have to carry all their belongings around with them during the day. It is a place that offers an opportunity "to heal, and to work toward their goals of housing, healthcare, and employment."

This is a place not just for folks to sleep overnight. It is a bright, clean, warm space, decorated with are by clients. It is a place where community can be built, opportunity acted upon, and hope for a peaceful future. And prayerfully consider a donation to the Thanksgiving Offering in support of this much needed, and well thought out adjunct to Preble Street. <u>Thank you</u> for considering this chance to help the homeless.

Please look for the Special Thanksgiving Offering Envelopes in the pew racks. If you are writing a check for any special offering please put the name of that special offering in the notation line of your check or on the envelope. This helps those who count the offering to identify where a check or special envelope goes as far as bookkeeping is concerned.

The sale of the parsonage is completed!

The sale of the parsonage is a strategic recommendation included in FCC's longrange plan, and approved by the congregation in December, to better align the congregation with its core mission, current membership levels and future church financial needs and abilities.

The parsonage was listed on May 20th at \$475,000, with offers requested by May 24th. The Ministry Governing and Finances accepted the best offer of \$555,000 (\$80,000 over asking price) and closing occurred on June 29.

After pre-sale expenses (new septic system, patio and back stairs rebuild, boundary survey) and post-sale expenses (realtor commissions, title & transfer fees), net proceeds from the sale are \$508,806.38.

The net proceeds are currently in a cash account at the church's investment management firm. It is hoped that these proceeds will help improve the church's financial operating expense gap and help achieve long-range plan objectives. The church council and church ministries should consult the long-range plan in developing specific proposals that may require funding to be incorporated into the annual budgeting process or special meeting approval.

Shortly before closing, a land survey completed by St.Clair Associates showed the parsonage garage to be too close to church property lines (non-conforming lot). To avoid closing delays and to reduce the risk of negating the sale, G&F made the decision to transfer a small 2,175 sq. ft. slice of land to make the Parsonage 'conforming' with set-back requirements. The buyer is responsible for updating deeds and related legal work.

Men's Fellowship, final home improvements and cleaning of the parsonage Elaine Sederlund, assistance with coordinating access to the parsonage by the multiple people working on the property throughout the process of prepping the parsonage for sale

- Everyone on the Ministry of Gov & Finances, with special recognition for Cliff Colville who served as project lead. He put in countless hours from the start of the sales process to the end doing a great job working with all involved.

FOOD TABLE

Also, label what all items are and specifically note if there are nuts included, or if they are sugar and/or gluten free. This is for food safety purposes (allergies, etc.). All baked items need to be wrapped or bagged.

CANDY TABLE

Needhams; Fudge; Any other candy you are famous for! These items should be pre-bagged with at least 2 items per bag.

COOKIE WALK

Dozens of cookies! This is a very popular table at the fair and we almost always sell out. Cookies must be pre-bagged with 2 cookies per bag.

JEWELRY TABLE

Any unwanted or no longer worn costume jewelry in good condition. A box has been placed in the narthex of the church for donations. Donations can also be given to either Sandy Elder, Mary Ellen Bossom or Barbara Grotton.

CRAFT TABLE

If you are crafty, we are always looking for ornaments, knit goods, fleece hats and scarves, etc.

CHRISTMAS TABLE

Have you been cleaning out your Christmas decorations to get rid of those you no longer use? We can use them! Please be sure they are clean and unbroken. We will also take ribbon and wrapping paper, Christmas plates and mugs, string lights in working order.
