PASTOR'S MESSAGE:

Grateful Praise

While we attach many characterizations to God, the one I think about in the springtime is God as the Creator. It is hard not to as the season changes from winter to spring and the earth warms, and buds on the trees begin to open, and daffodils in our gardens begin to bloom. Warm days invite us to open our windows and they call us out of our houses to look at the land and the sky. God does some beautiful work! It is inspiring. We might even want to sing about the beauty of the earth, as poet Folliott S. Pierpoint did in the 1864, when he composed the hymn of thanksgiving, "For the Beauty of the Earth." We still sing it today.

For the Beauty of the Earth, for the glory of the skies,

For the love which from our birth over and around us lies

Lord of all to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise!

For the beauty of each hour, of the day and of the night, hill and vale, and tree and flower, sun and moon and stars of light, Lord of all to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise!



The earth is beautiful, and it belongs to God. We sometimes forget this. But Psalm 24 reminds us, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein."(1) And it is our job to take care of it, which the book of Genesis tells us: "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and keep it." (2:15)

God has charged us to practice good stewardship of the earth's environment and natural resources. What this means is that we must treat all of nature as sacred and manage it for the sake of making God's good creation better. When God created the earth, he said that we are to replenish it (Gen 1:28), not deplete it. We are called to honor God by the choices we make, and to not neglect or abuse the earth.

Many years ago my church's missions committee wanted to do something to honor Earth Day, so we obtained some seedlings from the Arbor Day Foundation and handed them out to

church members one Sunday, asking them to plant them. I planted a few seedlings in my yard - most of them did not make it. But one survived, and now it is a large tree. I would like to take credit for this, but I know that the tree's flourishing is the work of the Creator - the Divine, mysterious Source of life - the One who makes hearts beat and causes seeds to germinate.

God's healing and resurrecting love is at work in all of God's good creation. And it is glorious and beautiful! This springtime, I pray we will renew our appreciation of the gift of our earth, and that we will not turn our backs on God's trust in us to care for it.

And I hope that maybe, just maybe the next time you feel a beautiful warm day calling you to enjoy the miracles of creation happening just outside your door, your heart will be filled with humility at the wonder of it. You might even sing a song of grateful praise to our Creator God, who is Lord of it all.

SCARBOROUGH POLICE SPECIALISTS TO ADDRESS COMMUNITY ISSUES AT APRIL 30th NEIGHBORING

Scarborough Social Services Navigator, Lauren Dembski-Martin and Community Resource Officer, Eric Greenleaf of the Scarborough Police Department will speak to the congregation present at neighboring on Sunday April 30th. Ms. Dembski-Martin will speak about the homeless in Scarborough and how she works with this group to provide important care and services. And, how we should interface with homeless individuals who come to our church, beyond making them feel welcome, as we do all who come through our doors, and how best to react and respond to behavior different from the norm for our church should this occur.

Veteran Police Officer Eric Greenleaf will speak to the important issues of Church Security amid the multiple episodes of violence at so-called "Soft Targets" such as schools and churches. He has an important message for our congregation to hear and understand the reality of our town and the era in which we live. How prepared is our church today? What steps might we take to better secure the church and our congregation for the future?
