PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Sacramental

Every first Sunday of the month we celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion in our worship service. Maybe you have noticed how, at the end of the invitation to the sacrament, I say these words: "Come not because you must, but because you may." These words are not original to me. They are part of a Communion liturgy that was programmed into my soul as a congregant of my home church a long time ago.

When I first heard these words, "Come not because you must, but because you may," I was grateful for what they said to me. They told me that receiving Christ in the sacrament of Holy Communion was a gift of pure grace. It was an offering being made to me. I was not being told what to do. I was being given an opportunity and I had the freedom to choose to participate or not, which is a deeply held value of mine. I was welcome, as all are welcome into the hospitality of Christ's table. This means a lot!



When the church body gathers to celebrate a sacrament, it is a time like no other gathering - for in it we believe that Christ is mysteriously present in our midst. The theological definition of *sacrament* is that it is an *outward visible sign of an inward invisible grace*. The movement of the Spirit among us is a mystery that defies explanation. But every so often, we know that God has touched us, and when this happens, it is amazing.

The church is like nothing else that exists on earth. We believe our church building is God's house and that God comes to dwell here with us. Yet sometimes we forget to trust that God is a partner in our present work and in our planning for the future. It is true that we are a part of the church which Jesus started over two millennia ago. It was Jesus who taught the first teachers and ministers, and he gave his very life for it so we would know the love of God to its full extent. Jesus told those who believed in him that they could "come to him when they were weary and heavy burdened, and he would give them rest." How wonderful! He gave the church the sacraments to keep its members vitally connected with him and his Spirit.

No doubt these are gifts to us in our own time and place. And you and I are always welcome to come and find Christ here – *not because we must but because we may.* I am always amazed at how many people walk away from this generous invitation. And I am always grateful for those who accept it.

Over the next few months we, as a congregation, are beginning to do the hard work of transition and transformation for our church. We are in this together. And I believe we'll be in our best form if we begin with Jesus' invitation to live as sacramental people. As we embrace this work, which is an opportunity to grow in our self-understanding, we will have greater success when we invite God into the process and trust God and each other as sacred partners.

I have no doubt that the gifts of Jesus' church always remain, regardless of the outcome of our future work. Yet as we begin, we must not forget the sacramental power we have in the mystery of Spirit that is just waiting to touch us and transform us into something we haven't even yet imagined. Will we be a part of this work of God and God's people? Will we be open to join in "because we may?"
