MINISTER'S CORNER

Dear Friends:

During our church's Annual Meeting on July 12th, the question of when we might worship in person again was raised. At the meeting it was agreed that we won't hold any services in the sanctuary for the rest of the summer, but we will revisit the subject in September. Hopefully, God willing, the threat from the COVID 19 virus will have eased by then. That being said, I want to update you on plans for two other types of church worship services that I'm in the process of preparing for with the help of the Ministry of Worship and Spiritual Care and other I individuals in the church. Please note that, depending on the circumstances, these plans may need to change.

First, on Sunday, August 2nd at 9:30 a.m., I am planning to have a Communion service outside in the church parking lot. It will be different than the previous parking lot service we had in May because, rather than remaining In the car, chairs will be set up so people can sit and take part in the service.

Social distancing guidelines will still be adhered to so the chairs will be spaced at least 6 feet apart, those in attendance will be required to wear masks, and greetings will be limited to waving and air hugging one another, We have order some sealed, individual Communion packets that will allow us to safely receive the elements of bread and grape juice. We will once again be asking people to RSVP so we have an idea of how many people will be coming to worship, The details are still being worked out for you, but you will be notified when the preparation for this Communion service is finalized.

And second, we are getting ready to have worship services via *Zoom* on Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m. (our usual time of worship), beginning on August 9th. I have subscribed to *Zoom Pro* and it will allow us to log in and worship together through our computers, tablets and smart phones. There is also an option to dial in using your telephone so you can listen to and verbally participate in the worship service. (You should know that calling in to *Zoom* gatherings will not be toll free, so if your telephone service doesn't included long distance you will be charged).

We recently had the church's annual meeting via Zoom and it worked very well, so there's no reason why it won't work just as well for worship services. But again, the details are still being worked out, and you will be notified when the planning for this *Zoom* service is complete. I'm very excited about these worship opportunities, and I look forward to leading them and seeing you again. Please contact me if you have any questions or thoughts.
