MINISTER'S CORNER

Dear Friends:

The Ministry of Worship and Spiritual Care and I are moving forward with plans to resume worship services in our church sanctuary beginning on Sunday, May 9th. Everyone is anxious to have in person worship again, but I can't stress enough that we will doing it differently for a while. In last month's newsletter I shared the guidelines we will be following so that everyone who attends will be as safe as possible, but I thought I would do so again this month (they have been slightly modified).

Attendance will be limited to 30-35 people. The number will depend on how many families come who are able to sit close together in the same pew.

Attendance will be <u>by reservation only</u>. People will need to call the church office at 883-2342 from Monday through Thursday and leave a message if no one is there, or on Friday morning. <u>Requests to attend worship that come after Elaine, our church secretary, leaves on Friday afternoon will <u>have to be declined</u> to help keep things simple and organized. People who show up on Sunday morning without having first called the office to reserve a seat in the sanctuary will, regretfully, have to be turned away.</u>

We will be taking contact information from those who make a reservation (unless we already have that information on file) so that we can notify attendees if someone who was COVID positive attended the service.

Temperatures will be taken at the door with a forehead thermometer before people are admitted into the church building. Everyone will be encouraged to use hand sanitizer when entering and exiting the church.

Wearing masks will be required. No mask, no entry.

Social distancing practices will need to be followed by everyone as they enter the church, sit in church and exit the church. Pews will be marked to allow for distancing and separation.

People will enter and exit the church building by the front door only, in an orderly and socially distanced way. Entering through the back door (near the organ) will be prohibited to insure our organist's wellbeing.

The rest room will be available, but people will be asked to use it only if it is absolutely necessary because it will need to be cleaned after each use.

There will be no Neighboring for the time being.

There will not be a choir. Bethany and Wendy (and hopefully some special musicians or soloists) will provide music. The congregation may sing hymns but will need to wear masks and sing softly.

There will not be Bibles in the pews, but people are welcome to bring their own Bibles if they wish.

For those aren't able to make a reservation or who have been worshipping on Zoom and want that to continue, we are going to try to live-stream the sanctuary worship service so they can view it at home. They will not be able to interact and chat with one another the way they could during past Zoom worship services, but they will be able to "attend" the worship service virtually.
