The human story of the expedition includes encounters of mutual benefit and chaos. Among the "leaders and lads" were the captains and chiefs, expedition members and Native American hunters-warriors they encountered. Particular attention is given to Chiefs Sheheke, Cameahwait, and Coboway. The expedition's intent was peaceful exploration. How did it play out?

Jimmy Mohler works as study leader for Road Scholar Lewis and Clark Tours. She was a seasonal ranger on the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail for the National Park Service and the U.S. Forest Service.

Jimmy is an active member of the Missouri-Kansas Riverbend Chapter of the Lewis and Clark Trail Heritage Foundation. She is best known for her volunteering over several years to monitor and coordinate improvements to the Lewis and Clark historic markers in the chapter's area.
