Director Miss Sally's Message

What a difference each day brings! As I look back to the decision to close school for 2 weeks, it seems incredible now, given what we are learning, that we thought 2 weeks would handle this virus. The Fullerton School District announced that they will be closed until May 11, although that could always

change. The uncertainty of all of this situation makes its impact that much worse. Decisions are made based on the best information at the time. Each day brings new information, causing decisions to be altered. Everyone on your Board of Directors is doing their best to guide FCNS through this global crisis. I am so happy to be working with such dedicated people. We have created a unique community - united by a business - yet also united by friendship, caring, and love of children.

We held our monthly board meeting as a conference call; thanks to Becky Anderson, our new president, for setting this up. We are learning to adapt. I was reminded by a director in a co-op director's forum that I belong to about

the theory of Jean Piaget - whom we all study in child development. Piaget, talked about how children and adults understand our world. When everything seems to make sense, we experience equilibrium. When some new information comes in and knocks our understanding on its side, and doesn't seem to make sense with what we thought we knew, we call that disequilibrium. But guess what? Disequilibrium is the state where a bunch of big learning takes place, because we first have to assimilate that new information into our existing schema, and then we learn

gradually to accommodate it, until our understanding of the world has grown forever. Kids experience this all the time, over and over, and it's just as hard on them as it is on adults right now. We are all adapting and accommodating. **Director's Message** pp. 1-5

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Miss Sally Group 4 p. 12 We will follow the school District at this point - making it official that FCNS is closed until at least May 11. The Tanaka Farms field trip is canceled, as is Family Fun Day. The teachers are going to be reaching out to their students with greetings and ideas of things to do. It may come by email, video, phone calls - we will adapt! Housekeeping and Maintenance days are canceled until further notice.

While the Board was reviewing the school's financial state and sustainability in this unprecedented time, we discovered that our bylaws actually address the current situation. It states in Article XIII, Section 1, D. Closure of School:

- 1. Full tuition shall be charged during months in which there are holiday and vacations within the school year.
- 2. During emergency closure of school, as for communicable disease epidemics, tuitions will still be due.

The By-Laws can be found on our website.

About 75% of tuition payments for March has been received. These payments will support teacher payroll for March, April, and May, as well as overhead expenses. If you have not paid March tuition yet, please make your payment. You can pay on line through Jovial, or mail a check to the school. Keep in mind that we have had to cancel Family Fun Day - a fundraiser. We are no longer selling scrip, and our See's order is bound to be lower.

With regard to payments for STEM and Spanish, we ask you to consider it as a tax-deductible donation (our non-profit ID# is 95-1736903). We could provide you with a receipt.

We truly appreciate the support of the community, as we also respect and are sensitive to each and everyone's particular situation. Tuition for April and May will be suspended, unless we are able to return. If we return in May we will prorate tuition.

Slate of Incoming Officers

We are looking for a new secretary for next year's board. The job would start in July taking the minutes of the meetings and emailing reminders of the board meetings. The meetings are the third Wednesday of the month, at 7 PM, at school. We are also looking for someone to take on First Vice President in charge of Maintenance. This person schedules the maintenance days all year - putting the reminders in cubbies, along with the keys for the foreman. She/he emails reminders, attends the board meetings as a voting member, sends articles to the newsletter once a month. The person does the laundry basket once a week as well! The other



portion of this job is a handyman/woman. The last 4 years, one family did both jobs, but

we can easily split it into 2 jobs - one for a handy person, one for scheduling and attending the board meetings. If either of these jobs sound like something you would like to do, please email me. These officers will be voted on at some point, in some way.

Summer School

We are certainly hoping for summer school to happen this June, but it remains an unknown. If all goes well, this is what our summer school will be this year: there will be two 2-week sessions, June 1-11 and June 15-25. You can sign up for one session or two. Sometimes parents split a session with another family if they are going to be out of town - that is something you have to arrange. The sessions are Monday - Thursday, 9 - noon, no parent participation required. We will take a maximum of 36 kids, first come, first served. Sign-ups were scheduled to begin Monday, April 27 we will keep you informed as to how that will happen as we get closer. The cost is \$180 per 2 week session.

Tile Fundraiser

Would you like to have a tile hung in the breezeway to commemorate your year(s) at FCNS? The price will be \$40 per tile. We are going to see how things play out to decide how to do this. We could easily do it during summer school. We just have to wait and see when we are able to resume social un-distancing.

Some Ideas

Are you looking for things for the kids to do? I have a suggestion, you may think I'm crazy. If you live in a home with some planters, consider taking a section of it and make a mud pit. TREASURER'S NOTE

Budget Review and Tuition Increase for 2020-2021

Hello everyone! I hope this month's JJJ finds you all in good health and spirits. Stepping into the role of treasurer has been a learning experience and very insightful on how much goes on behind the scenes to keep our school in working order. I find myself lucky to be working with a great group of people with a strong sense of community and commitment to our school and its families.



After reviewing the Treasurer's preliminary budget for next year, the board is proposing a \$10 increase in the 2-day classes and a \$15 increase in the 3-day classes. This increase of about a 6% is to help cover overhead costs (i.e. rent and variable utilities), staff pay raises to adjust for increased cost of living, and mostly for the elimination of scrip.

The proposed group rates for Group I and III will be \$170 a month and Group II and IV will be \$240 a month. The voting date is yet to be determined. Thank you for supporting our teachers and the financial health of our school.
