

Summer School Sign up, Monday, May 2

As a reminder: There will be two 2-week sessions, June 6-16 and June 20-30. You can sign up for one session or two. The sessions are Monday-Thursday, 9- noon, no parent participation required. The cost of each session is \$200. We will take a maximum of 24 kids, each session, first come, first served. Mother's Teas

Last Mandatory Meeting

Your last mandatory meeting is a picnic at Craig park in Fullerton. On Tuesday, May 10 and Friday, May 13 you should bring your child to school at 9AM, but pick them up at 10:30 and head over to the park. We will make sandwiches for the kids at school and the parents will have a potluck lunch. Sign ups are on the windows now. We will vote on 2 board members. Kate Davis has agreed to continue on as our Secretary and Rose hallis has volunteered to continue on as Maintenance scheduler (which is also a first vice president position). We will also vote on the tuition increase- 2 day classes- \$190/mo. 3 day classes' \$285/mo. Finally, we will hear our Historian report, written by Amy Wozniak, our Historian. Tuition increase background

I just wanted to give you a little perspective on our tuition cost. While you may look at the increase and think \$10 per month is a lot, the actual hourly rate for your child will be \$7.91- or \$23.73 per day, with the proposed increase. It is less than \$100 per year, as you pay for 9 months. Babysitting is significantly higher than that and look at all they get here- with learning materials, activities, music, story times, and group play and learning. Some public schools have pre-school programs (not the TK programs) that charge less, but they don't have the same costs- rent and utilities, primarily. More importantly, they don't have our community of like-minded families that create opportunities for lifelong friends, or the opportunity to serve on a board to add to your resume. When you add in smaller class size and experienced teachers trained in child development, FCNS is a great deal!



Goal Setting Meeting

On Wednesday, May 18, we are going to have a goal setting meeting at 7 PM on zoom. If you would like to join us, we'd love to have people with creative ideas and enthusiasm for keeping FCNS going strong! Join us!

Our focus may be the playground shade issue, but also the kinds of things we are thinking about to compete with TK and Universal Preschool. We would love to have input from our families about what we could offer that would be useful to them! Ideas could include more extended days, a 5-day program, after school 1 hour classes- children's yoga, Spanish, or STEM. Other ideas welcome! If you can't make the meeting, drop us and email!

The Building Next Door

Have you seen all the work going on next door? Here is what is happening. The cities of Fullerton and Buena Park received a 4 yr., 20 million dollar grant for the HOPE Center- Homeless Outreach and Proactive Engagement Center. It will be a dispatch center, bringing together social services, mental health officials, and police departments in one location. They will send out the appropriate people to service calls about homeless folks. The goal is to not have the regular police handling these calls, but specially trained people that can provide better help. I have had 3 visits from the Fullerton Police chief, Roger Dunn. Each time I have been assured that the homeless will not be relocated to the building, and put us in any danger. There will be an interview room there, that could be used to do a private interview, if needed. I feel comfortable with the project and our safety.

The people we have met so far could not have been kinder. When the wind blew our easy-up on the roof, these guys got it down for me. We complained about workers parking in our spots, and suddenly, they are gone! We will benefit in a number of ways. They are putting 1.5 million dollars into upgrading the area. The street will be paved, the buildings will be painted, and we get to keep some storage areas in the north side of our building. Having police next door and a hospital at the end of the street is a good thing!




We celebrated lots of April birthdays this month! Happiest to Marc, Leo and Anya!

Teacher's Message: Miss Sally, Group IV

Lots of spring activities going on in class this month!

We did some egg experiments last week as a part of our topic- what comes from eggs? We dissolved the shell of an egg by soaking it in vinegar. We tested the strength of eggshells by stacking books on top of them (they are stronger than you think). We made our bird's nests and hunted for eggs. We dissolved jelly beans in water.





Last week we explored snails, frogs, and checked out earthworms.

We had a special art project for Earth day. There was some excitement and fear in using the glue gun with adult supervision. There were no mishaps! A few minor "Ouch's", but no tears!
