

Bible Study 11 13 2014 Get in Position by Bishop Manning

2 Kings 2:9-11 New King James Version (NKJV)

9 And so it was, when they had crossed over, that Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask! What may I do for you, before I am taken away from you?" Elisha said, "Please let a double portion of your spirit be upon me."

10 So he said, "You have asked a hard thing. Nevertheless, if you see me when I am taken from you, it shall be so for you; but if not, it shall not be so." 11 Then it happened, as they continued on and talked, that suddenly a chariot of fire appeared with horses of fire, and separated the two of them; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.

Be sure to be at the right place to be in God's will for your life, it's important whose leadership you put yourself under and who you allow to speak into your life. Words are powerful, and God promised Elisha, that he would have a double portion of Elijah's anointing. But God said through Elijah, Elisha, it will happen under one condition, not how much you pray, not how many Scriptures you can quote.

You have to be in the right place at the right time by God's watch, you have to stay close to Elijah. Many years Elisha was faithful, he followed this old man everywhere he goes. In fact, a couple of times, Elijah tried to get rid of him and tried to lose him, but Elisha stayed focus right with him. Elisha was determined to succeed.

Elisha's job was to help take care of Elijah, he would take him food and water, and help him in ministry. In the natural, what he was doing seemed insignificant. Elisha's friends question his loyalty to Elijah ministry. But what his friends could not see is that Elisha had a dream from God, and he was willing to go all the way to the end. He had a desire that if he was at the right place at the right time God was going to give him a double portion of Elijah's anointing. Elisha knew as he stayed close to Elijah, little by little, that the same anointing would flow through him in a greater way.

Stay in Position, sometimes it's difficult, but He's not finished with you yet, this same anointing is available for you tonight. He's not finished with you yet, stay in position, Elisha was faithful even when he did not feel like it, even when he wasn't appreciated or getting the attention that he deserved. Elisha knew that his destiny is connected to Elijah. When you stayed faithful to God's commitment, He will give you a double portion in this season in Jesus name...Amen...
