

SS 1 4 2015 YOUR STORM IS OVER BY BISHOP MANNING


SCRIPTURE: PSALM 107: 28 TO 29...28 Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, And He brought them out of their distresses. **29**He caused the storm to be still, So that the waves of the sea were hushed.
