Dear Parents and Carers,

#### WHAT DO I DO?

Most parents are comfortable with the idea that all children are at different points on the academic intelligence ladder. Kids learn to read, write or count at different rates. As parents we can identify an area of need in our child and we can go about strengthening that by learning our times tables or learning our spelling words for example.

Many parents are less comfortable with the idea that children are all at different points on the emotional intelligence ladder. Kids learn social and emotional skills and understandings at different rates. It can be upsetting to a parent if their child is having emotional difficulties with other children and it is hard to know what to do. **Do** – stay calm, take the longer road and focus on supporting your child with the skills, knowledge and attitude they need to have successful interactions with others. This approach empowers your child and it lets them know that they have the capacity to improve and that their happiness and success comes from them and is not reliant on someone else.

**DON'T BLAME** – don't get emotional and blame your child, your partner or yourself and especially do not blame other children if your child is having social / emotional difficulties. The thought that "my child would be happy if other children would change their behaviour" will disempower your child and will not help them to learn or be happy.

I sometimes get the word *bullying* rolled out into a conversation where a child is having social issues with another child. For bullying to occur you need an imbalance of power, you need intent and you need repetition. If a couple of Grade 1 girls are having issues and are trying to work out their role in the relationship they may manipulate, exclude, ignore, tell on or be mean to each other – this is not pleasant but it is developmentally normal. Parents may want to jump in and save their child – but they will deny their child the chance to learn.

If, as a parent, you find yourself talking about some else's child in a manner that is derogatory – please pause for a minute – because you are an adult and this is bullying. Evey child is special – every child deserves our respect.
