The 2018 preps this week are focused on the letter B, looking at different shapes and have had a P.E. session with their buddies. The Grade 1/2's are working hard at handwriting and did a KWL (know, want to know, and learnt) for a reading activity. The Grade 3/4's are developing their Growth Mindset and NAPLAN style literacy activities. The Grade 5/6's are advancing their writing skills with A-Z writing and learning coding in the pod. Thunder lost to Hot Shots 4-13


# Grade 5/6 Poetry





Oh how I adore you


## Oh Sheeba
