# **SWIMMING PROGRAM 2018**

Due to the major redevelopment of the pool area in Bairnsdale, we have only just received our swimming program notification. This program will commence a little later this month as the BARC needed to adapt programs and timetables to fit with the

redevelopment schedule. Lauren has done a super job of liaising with the BARC to ensure that the swimming program goes ahead for us. *Lessons for all grades will take place in the big pool this year.* Lauren and I have been working with the BARC to ensure that all students are working safely at their level. As a school we really value the swimming program. Staff and School Council acknowledge the responsibility we have to provide opportunities for our students to learn to swim given our close proximity to the lakes and the accessibility of water sports. We are hoping to have permission notes to parents next week. Cost of swimming lessons *will be approximately \$145*.

# CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND (CSEF).

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund is available again this year for eligible families. This payment of \$125 per eligible student can be used for school camps or trips, swimming and school-organised sport programs, excursions and incursions.

#### WHO CAN APPLY.

On the first day of term one (29 January 2018) or the first day of term two (18 April 2018), a parent or legal guardian of a student must:

- be an eligible beneficiary of one of these cards: Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card
- **OR** they must be a temporary foster parent
- **AND** the parent or legal guardian must submit an application by the due date.

Parents who receive a carer allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Eligibility will be determined when the parent's concession card successfully validates with Centrelink on either the first day of term one or term two.

If the eligible card is in the name of the student, the fund is only granted to that student, not their siblings. **CRITERIA** 

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years.

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, TAFE or who are home schooled.
