Dear Families,

During Term 2, Paynesville Primary School will be trialling a new system to manage formal communication with the School Community, attendance tracking, permission slips for excursions and an online school diary.

The system is called **'uEducateUs'**, which can be accessed via a standard web browser <u>https://login.ueducateus.com.au/</u> or smart-phone app. The app is available for both Apple and Android devices.

'uEducateUs' will supplement current communication channels, the school newsletter will continue to include all pertinent information for the school community and paper-based permission slips will still go home with students.

Families will be given accounts (a user name and password), to access the system. Only parents or guardians recognised by the Education Department are eligible to receive an account. The account credentials will be given to students to take home in the coming days. If you do not receive one, you are able to pick up a copy of your username and password from the office.

We encourage families to download the smart-phone app and log-in using the credentials provided. Assistance with using the application can be provided by the school office on an ad-hoc basis, *alternatively we will have a parent-helper present at school on Friday* 4th May to walk families through the application *in person.*

Why would I want to use uEducateUs?

We believe the case is compelling, once users become used to interacting online. Some of the interactions that are possible, include;

- Parents/ Guardians will be able to check a student's attendance online.
- Parents/ Guardians will be able to give permission for their child to attend an excursion online at the click of a button.
- Parents/ Guardians will be able to submit absence notes online from home.
- Parents/ Guardians will be able to check the school diary online.

Of course, we always welcome families into the school in person and appreciate the generous time and effort that is spent in the classroom by all the school community helpers. uEducateUs is only ever intended to make some interactions with the school more convenient for families.
