#### **ELECTRONICS DAY**

Electronics Day will be held on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March. Electronics Day is when students can bring a device to school and are allowed to play it during a session, decided by their classroom teacher. If you would prefer your child did not participate in Electronics Day, please let your child's classroom teacher know. Devices will be kept in the teacher's office while they are not being used during

the session. Wi–Fi is unavailable so students cannot use games that need Wi-Fi. Devices will be returned to students at the end of the day. There will be no inappropriate games eg. guns and gore.

#### **SUSTAINABILITY**

Over the past 2 weeks the sustainability team have been looking at composting. All class rooms now have a compost bin for food waste. The children have had discussions about what can and can't go into the compost and why it is important.

When food waste sits in landfill it creates methane which pollutes our atmosphere. On the other hand, when we compost food scraps they can, with time, be used to help our plants in the veggie garden to grow.



This week Rebecca Lamble, the Resource Smart Schools facilitator, came to school to help do a waste audit. The sustainability team conducted a mini 'war on waste',

measuring the amount of waste in the school bins and sorting one of the bins to assess what our main waste materials are. The kids did an amazing job given that it was quite time consuming and smelly work!



#### Our results showed that by weight:

36% of the waste was rubbish

33% paper and cardboard

28% food scraps

2.8% other recyclable materials

We are hoping that having the compost bins will eliminate our food waste from the main bins and then we can focus on developing strategies to reduce our other waste materials. Thanks to everyone who helped us out on Tuesday!





#### COMPOST RECIPE

- 2 parts brown waste (dry leaves, straw, wood chips, saw dust)
- 1 part green waste (veggie scraps, grass clippings, coffee grounds)
- **Air**: turn compost once a week to make sure that the decomposers in the compost get the oxygen they need to do their job
- **Moisture**: the compost should be as moist as a wrung-out sponge. Decomposers in the compost require water to survive.

Note: the brown and green waste are added gradually in layers.

# Would you like to visit China in 2019?

### Information Evening WEDNESDAY 6th MARCH at 6:00pm in School Library.

This year is the fourth time Paynesville Primary School students, parents and staff will travel to China. While we are there we visit the modern city of 28 million people that is Shanghai, we visit Suhouz, Venice of the East with it's beautiful canals, laneways and markets. We visit Changshu where we meet up with our friends at our sister school. We travel by overnight sleeper train to Beijing where we visit the Forbidden City, Tiananmen Square and the Great Wall of China.

There are many wonderful sights and sounds – but the highlight for me is meeting up with our Chinese sister school. The relationships we have developed are very special and there are many families in our school who remain close friends with Chinese families they have hosted when they visited us.

During the 10 day trip we stay in motels and eat out at local restaurants. It is a busy schedule – but China is a busy place. The history, the culture, the sights and the sounds are amazing.

Parents must accompany their child(ren). This trip is mainly for Grade 5 and 6 students – but families decide on whether their child(ren) are ready for the adventure.

We travel in the September school holidays. The cost of flights will be *approximately* \$1200 return and the cost of in country accommodation, meals, travel (coach and train) and sight seeing is *approximately* \$1000.
