The Keeping Place - 26/6/19

Today we went to the Keeping Place. It is a place where there are lots of traditional Kurnai tales and information. We had a tour guide. First he told us a dreamtime story, which means something that could happen or something that has happened.

I also learned that if you are over 34 you can stay with your tribe but if you were younger you would get taken away from your family if you were part Indigenous. They thought it would be better for them and at the age of 14 they would go and work for a farmer. I personally don't think it is better for them.

The Keeping Place - 26/6/19

Today at the Keeping Place I learned that on Christmas to make the jelly stay cold the Indigenous people stored the jelly in the cold river. I also learned how the Indigenous people made paint, to make the paint the Indigenous people rubbed rocks together so it made dust and then they added water and mixed it together. At the Keeping Place I saw heaps of photos of the Indigenous people and woven baskets.
