FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great nutdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concassion card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowence is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSSF emount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- 5225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.stc.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school or 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family citicumstances.

Tou only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student encolments; your shift has started or shanged schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, charge of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
