#### Easter Hat Parade

Our annual Easter Hat parade will be held on Friday March 27th, 2020. This is the last day of the term and we felt it was a great way for families to start the School Holiday break.

#### COVID-19

In line with Department of Education advice, we would like to inform our parent community of the measures, we are undertaking at school in an attempt to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

- We have increased the cleaning of surfaces around the school. 'High traffic areas' such as door handles, light switches, keyboards, table tops and toilets are cleaned throughout the day. From Monday next week our cleaning company with have a cleaner at school from 11am to 3:30pm carrying out additional cleaning.
- Hand washing is encouraged and hand sanitiser is available for student use. Grade 1/2 students get a stamp on their hand in the morning and try to rub it off with handwashing by the end of the day. Great idea!
- We have been teaching students about coughing and sneezing into a clean tissue or their sleeve to prevent the spread of germs.
- Advice on social distancing at school has come through this morning. The DET acknowledges that it
  is not always practical for a distance of 1.5 metres between people to be applied to interactions with
  students, especially young students. It is important to note in this context that the Victorian Chief
  Health Officer's advice is that the risk of transmission represented by children appears to be low.
- There will be no excursions or camps until advised otherwise by the Department of Education.
- School assemblies will be held outside.
- Greetings will take the form of non-contact greetings.
- When students line up to enter class they will be encouraged to keep 1.5 metres between each other where possible.
- Classroom furniture and seating arrangements will provide maximum distance between students.
- Student group work will be suspended.
- Where possible teachers will avoid close proximity with students.

#### Think U Know program.

On Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March Justin McCallum, the Youth Liaison Officer of the Victoria Police, Bairnsdale will present the ThinkUKnow program to our students in Grade 3 – 6. ThinkUKnow is a national program delivering online child safety information in schools and organisations to parents, carers, teachers and students from the first year of school to Year 12.

The ThinkUKnow program gives students information on how to stay safe online. Topics included within the presentations are specifically aimed at educating and increasing awareness about online child sexual exploitation including avoiding unwanted contact, online grooming, self-generated content, sexual extortion and how to get help.
