Our annual student Market Day is coming up on the 9th December. I will provide you with a brief summary of what Market Day is all about...

Students in Grades 3 to 6 have the opportunity to run their own market stall. Generally students make small groups with their peers. Stalls vary from selling food items and craft products, to providing a service like nail painting or running an event or side show type game. Last year it was wonderful to see students who thought of stalls that were sustainable, sold recyclable products, plants or healthy food. If your students are providing prizes, it would be fantastic if students could think of alternatives to confectionery. Students generally complete the advertising component of their stall in school time and the rest is completed at home. Obviously the preparation for this event can require parent support and we thank you very much for this. It is a wonderful learning opportunity for our students and it is a very enjoyable afternoon.

The money raised from Market Day goes towards purchasing something we need for our school, what this will be is not confirmed as yet but I will consult with the Student Council and let you know ASAP.

Performance will begin at 6:30 pm.


Audience will need to bring their own outdoor seating (picnic blankets or folding chairs).
