## Dear Parents, Carers, Families and Members of our Community.

This week has been busy as usual. Lots of great things going on across the school in classrooms, specialist subjects, in the yard and other things such as MyGolf, Bowls Squad practice and Swimming trials.

This week's value of focus has been 'Positivity'. We are so privileged to have so many students that live their lives in a way that radiates positivity all day, every day. What amazing role models we have that enable others to enjoy being at school and being able to be supported and thrive. Thank you to you all.

In line with our Value of Safety I would just like to put in a reminder to all those driving around the school that the speed limit is 40km at all times. It is also important to know that the school operates with staff on duty from 8.30 am. There have been several students arriving much earlier than this and at these times the students can not be supervised and we can not legally look out for their safety.
