









paying for the tests they wish their children to take part in.


ONLINE SIMULATED MATHS OLYMPIAD (OSMO)

The Online Simulated Maths Olympiad (OSMO) conducted by the International Maths Olympiad Challenge (IMOC) is available for our students this year if they would like to take on the challenge. It will be conducted online on June 3-4,2023. (This is on a weekend so your child would need to have a device and do this at home). Since we are a Selected School, our students can take the Olympiad without fees. There are a couple of value-added services the Olympiad provides, which attract a fee, but you can opt for the 'Olympiad only' free version. To do so, you must first create a <u>login</u> and enrol at https://www.international-maths-olympiad.com/fees/ using the code (PPS@IMO) in the fees section. This code reduces the fees of any of the 4 Selected School courses by \$27, making the first course ('Olympiad only') a free version.
