Dear Paynesville Primary School families,

This year I am completing the Children's Medical Research Institutes 'Jeans for Genes' challenge. Their challenge is to run a 6km marathon without stopping!

This charity is really important because it raises money to help research better treatments and cures for children who are born with birth defects and genetic diseases. Genes are like the words and sentences in our human instruction manual. These instructions tell our body how to make our organs and how our body should work. Mistakes in these genetic instructions cause childhood cancers, as well as developmental problems that can affect almost any part of your body. Researching more about our genes will give families more information and children more treatment options. Better treatments might mean that children don't die or that children can go to school and play sports, rather than growing up in a hospital.

Everyone can be involved in supporting this charity. You can watch me do the run in August, talk about this Charity and issue with family and friends to raise awareness, or you can sponsor my marathon. 
