
Congratulations to Zayn Smith who played his first game in the senior league this week.



Hosting a Chinese Student: Aug 8th – 14th



A reminder that if you would like to host one or two of our sister school students from China in your home for a week (Aug 8 – Aug 14) then you need to let the school office know. We have a group of twenty Chinese students and two staff coming to Paynesville for the week. They come from a small town two hours from Shanghai. Their little town has only 2 million people – so they will love our little town and we will get them out and about experiencing beautiful East Gippsland.

New Crossing Being Built on Main Street

About two years ago the School Council approached the shire and Vic Roads about putting in some infrastructure around our school to support safe student travel to and from school.

The Shire have let me know that works for our new manned crossing will start within the next few weeks. During the construction process there will be considerable disruption to Main St on the South side of Ashley St. If your child(ren) crosses here then they will need to cross to the north of the Ashley and Main St intersection. You may like to take the time to have a look at the area when construction starts and work out a safe means of crossing Main St during construction.

Lolly Pop Person Needed

This is a manned crossing before and after school. We are looking for 2 volunteers to man this crossing in a voluntary capacity. There is a commitment to training involved. Our funding application for the paid position will go in at the start of October (this is the earliest possible time) and so these volunteers should have the opportunity to apply for a paid position (should the application be successful).



Financial Assistance

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.
