Some of the categories were: people with one or no legs, people in wheelchairs, blindness and people with one or no arms. For the theme song we played the song that Jay and Jack M wrote which discussed inclusion and celebrating difference. We demonstrated goal ball, a sport that's only played by blind people. The main message I got from learning about the Paralympics was that anyone can do anything if they put their mind to it and we shouldn't judge people by their appearance or their disability. Junior Schools Guest Speaker

Jeff McNeill came to visit the junior classes to tell us about the Paralympics. Jeff became blind when he was nine. Jeff is a Paralympian that competed in the 5000m, 10,000 and marathon. He got hit by a car in 2000 when he was training for the Sydney Paralympics. He came first in the championships in the 10,000 metres long distance race. He also did the high jump and the long jump. He came fourth on a count back in the high jump 2004 Sydney Paralympics.
