# Headlice Alert.



As the weather warms up it can trigger an outbreak - **So here are some nit facts:** 

- Lice do not fly.
- Lice do not jump.
- Lice do crawl from head to head.
- Lice do not discriminate.

Dirty hair, clean hair, long hair, short hair, curly hair, straight hair - they don't care. As long as it's warm and there's access to blood (via the scalp) they are as happy as a pig in mud.

But the news isn't all bad. According to the <u>Department of Health, Victoria</u>, there are two main things you can do to reduce the risk of contracting head lice. Comb through with an inexpensive conditioner and a fine tooth comb. This tends to stun them and make it hard for them to crawl and grip the hair. Keep your children's hair in plaits or ponytails to reduce the risk of spreading by crawling from head to head.

# Grade 5 Cycling Camp.



#### Forensic Science Grade 3 & 4


