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In writing we have begun our unit on personal narratives, creating plans for the first significant memory we have chosen to write about.






We have been exploring open-ended tasks in our unit on Numbers - trying out different strategies to write as many numbers as possible that contain the number '7'.











In respectful relationships, we had great fun working in partnerships to move plastic straws around the room that were just balanced between our fingers - some partnerships even managed to transport their straw under a table without dropping it! Now that's teamwork!







Grade 1/2/3 have also gained great enjoyment from their weekly Taekwondo Sessions doing lots of work on ducking and leaping.

Grade 3/4 Classroom Report



Students in 3 / 4 have focused on learning the writing process over the last fortnight. Students created a plan then a draft, they then revised and edited it before publishing it. Students shared their writing with each other and gave each other feedback to help improve their writing.



In Maths students have learnt addition and subtraction with large numbers. During mini lessons 3 / 4's have been using a whiteboard to solve equations and practise the new strategies as we go.

Grade 4/5 Classroom Report

The past couple of weeks have flown by in the 4/5 classroom!



In **reading** the students have been looking at the art of visualising while reading. They have drawn what they see in their heads as they read and also described the pictures. Some students have really enjoyed drawing the pictures as someone reads to them too! The students are starting to add quotes and making sure they add the page numbers to their Reader's Notebook entries too.

In writing it has been a very exciting week because all students have all returned their technology agreements and now have access to laptops! The kids have been waiting so patiently for them since the beginning of the year. The published work coming out of the students is immense and

our writing wall has been filled to the brim! We have had to move to the windows where students have written persuasive pieces about why we should save the bees.

In **maths** we have been looking at subtraction and rounding. We have looked at these functions in the real world too and used real menus to see how much change we will have left from \$50.00 after ordering a meal.

In **science** we have been looking at the importance of bees in the ecosystem. Students have made powerpoint presentations about bees and persuasive writing pieces about whether we should save them or not.

In **taekwondo** the students have joined in so well that they were actually able to learn a skill that nobody else got to learn - somersaults!

Grade 6 Classroom Report

In Grade 6 we have been engaging in many different learning activities. It has been amazing to see how eager students are to create their own book clubs. We have had two different book club books. One book club is looking at Once by Morris Glietzman



and I Survived: The American Revolution.

Students continue to engage in their writer's notebook. One activity that we completed involved making food characters which everyone enjoyed. Thanks for the idea Mrs Mathers! Students have started to write their own narratives about what they would do if they travelled back in time.

Our taekwondo sessions have been on Thursdays. Students have enjoyed learning new skills.

We are learning about different continents around the world. We are currently learning about Europe.

Judy recently trained Angus McCaskill and Spencer O'Riley to be our library monitors. The boys are able to help our class borrow and return books.

ICAS results and certificates

All assessments will be conducted online, at school. We will notify you of the date(s) that we will run ICAS assessments, and when your child's ICAS results are ready. Your child's ICAS certificates will be delivered to school. Once we have received them, we will present them to your child to bring home. The back of the certificate will show your child's ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin". - Use these to enter the Results Portal

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
