The Grade 1/2/3s have continued to settle into the classroom and build their learning routines. Students have learned to use their writers notebooks and their maths journals. It's been great to see a class community build and grow in this class.











# Grade 3/4 Classroom Report

Students from 3/4 were thrilled with the addition of DRAMA! to their weekly schedule, the class decided to call Mr. Vagues lessons DRAMA due to different roles they get to perform, it was then decided it needed an exclamation mark as it was loud and fun.

Class 3/ 4 also enjoyed a hockey clinic with Dave.

All took part and demonstrated the school values of Respect, Positivity, Learning and Safety.

Within the classroom, students have begun different types of group work and have enjoyed sharing their thinking with each other. Furthermore, we kicked off science with an interesting experiment of static electricity with balloons and tin cans. Over the term students will investigate different forces of motion and record their results in their books.

# Grade 4&5 Classroom Report



We have had a great couple of weeks in the 4/5 classroom!

**Writing:** In writing we have been continuing work to set up our Writer's Notebooks - filling them with amazing 'seed' ideas that they can then plant in their writing books and write about. The students enjoyed writing stories with a partner based off of 3 random words and also using photos to write about using their senses. We are currently refreshing our process of writing

a piece - from drafting to publishing, so hopefully we will have amazing work to display in our classroom soon!

**Reading:** In reading we have been making sure that we are using the 5

finger check to make sure that students are choosing the correct book for their reading time. Regular visits to the library are giving the students time to choose new books each week too. We are continuing



to use our 'CAFE' reading strategies to help decode

tricky words and make sense of what is being read.

**STEM:** Students have been learning about vessel water displacement and how this leads to boats floating. They have designed boats that they think will float. We will be floating these boats this week and testing to see 1. If they float and 2. How many paper clips they can carry. Those that displace a lot of water, creating more stability - should hold more paperclips and float more efficiently. They will be writing their predictions and conclusions.

**Maths:** In maths we are currently working on Graphs and data collection. The students have looked at different types of graphs and are now collecting their own data to create all sorts of different graphs.

**Spelling:** Students are really enjoying the new Soundwaves program - where we work through activities together and then they complete the relevant section of their worksheet. We have looked at lots of different phonemes - along with prefixes/suffixes, tense, breaking up words into individual sounds and much more. It has become a much loved part of our daily routine.

**Message from Miss S:** I just wanted to thank all parents and caregivers once again for continually supporting the amazing kids in my class. I absolutely love seeing their smiling faces each day and nothing makes me more happy than seeing them thrive. # FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
