20. To silence Satan's accusations (Job 1:11, 22)
21. To deepen our confidence in the Lord (Rom. 8:28)
22. To fellowship with Jesus Christ in His sufferings (1 Pet. 4:12-13)
23. To participate in Christ's glory (1 Pet. 4:13, 5:1).
