## CHOOSING OUR BASIC OUTLOOK

“Wherefore girding up the loins of your mind, be sober and set your hope perfectly on the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ” (1 Pt. 1:13).

Past, Present, and Future. On most days, our thoughts move from one to the other many times. Indeed, one of the marvels of the human mind is that we are able not only to enjoy the present but also to remember the past and anticipate the future.

But concerning the past and the future, there is an important choice to be made: will our primary outlook in life be backward or will it be forward? As great as the gift of memory can be, the past should not be the main focus of our minds. Since life moves only in one direction, forward, it is wise to make that the chosen direction of our character. We need to have made up our minds that biblical hope will be our basic, day-in-and-day-out orientation. And we need to be aware that that choice will often be difficult to make.

"Not that I have already obtained, or am already made perfect: but I press on, if so be that I may lay hold on that for which also I was laid hold on by Christ Jesus. Brethren, I count not myself yet to have laid hold: but one thing I do, forgetting the things which are behind, and stretching forward to the things which are before. I press on toward the goal unto the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (*Phil. 3:12-14*).

Paul wrote about forgetting the things which are behind and reaching forward to the things which are ahead. We need to shut out all of our past except that which will help us weather our tomorrows. What we are already experienced may have been painful or pleasant, but it must not be allowed to distract us from what is ahead. "Set your hope perfectly," Peter said, "on the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ."

Abraham is the great biblical example of a forward-looking person. During the long years of his pilgrimage in Canaan, there would have been many moments when his mind drifted back to his home in Ur, and these memories would not have been altogether bad. Yet he chose the future as his basic outlook, the decisive direction of his character: "for he looked for the city which hath the foundations, whose builder and maker is God" (*Heb. 11:10*).

We ought to be warned by the story of Lot's wife that there are times when it is dangerous to look back (*Gen. 19:23-26*). Jesus said, "Remember Lot's wife" (*Lk. 17:32*). And even when our memories are wholesome and helpful, it is wise to avoid getting "stuck" in the past. If even one day remains to us in this world, that means that there is good work yet to do — and the best is yet to come.

Beloved, look up and not down; and look forward and not back.
