But your iniquities have separated you from your God; and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear." Isaiah 59:1-2 It's not rocket science. God does not change (Malachi 3:6) and if your relationship with God has gone sour, it's not God's, your family's or anyone else's fault; you basically cannot blame anyone but you!

So, what is the obvious and simple solution to the relationship issue? YOU go back to God! The father of the Prodigal Son Parable did not dive into the pig pen to save the son; the son "came to himself" (Luke 15:17); he owned his predicament and went home.
